# No Respect for Retrospect

A DAM C. ENGST'S ARTICLE ON backing up files ("Be Safe, Not Sorry," February 1999) was helpful, but I wish it had told more about using Retrospect. This program is an incredible pain to use. I'd gladly switch to anything else.

Save and restore functions are so strange to set up that I have no confidence in them, and confidence is what a backup is all about. Retrospect's strange naming convention uses the word *volume* instead of *folder*; and in other ways seems different from the Mac environment. The main menus look easy to use, but once you get to any submenu you quickly get lost in nonsense. Ultimately, I find myself going to the wrong menus all the time.

Do I have to read the 200-page manual to do something as simple as back up



files? Other backup packages I've used had the same functionality with almost no learning curve. A Mac is supposed to be easy to use. Retrospect is not.

## QuarkXPress Quirk

A SUSUAL, DAVID BLATNER'S QUARK-XPress tips are smart and enlightening ("Unleash the Power of QuarkXPress 4," Create, February 1999). One of the tricks, though, sounded too good to be true. In fact, when I select Text To Box, even holding the option key, the outlined box does not replace the text but moves to the top of the containing box. You can easily verify this by typing lowercase letters without ascenders and then applying the trick.

Whenever Quark decides to give us a tool comparable to the one FreeHand and Illustrator delivered more than ten years ago (converting text to an outline without moving it somewhere else), it will be too late.

scores, including documentation, software, and ease of installation.

I also feel your description of XLR8's daughtercards as "based on PowerLogix's designs" is inaccurate. These boards were reengineered and only tangentially owe a debt to the original PowerLogix design. XLR8 has done some hard work on their new boards, and it deserves to be acknowledged.

Additionally, unlike the XLR8 Mach Speed G3 400, the Newer G3 400 was not shipping at the time your review was published. While you did not formally endorse the Newer G3 400 in your conclusion, the benchmark identifies it as the fastest card. Your dismissal of the XLR8 400 is curious, considering that XLR8 was the first to ship a 400MHz G3 daughtercard. The bias expressed toward Newer may prove misleading to buyers of these high-end boards, particularly to owners of Mach 5 9600's.

We didn't recommend any 400MHz cards including the Newer Technology and XLR8 cards—because in our opinion those cards simply aren't worth the high price for all but the most hard-core users who are unable to upgrade to a new Mac. Sheer speed is not the only factor in choosing an upgrade card.—Ed.

THE REVIEW OF GRAPHIC SIMulations' (GSC) F/A-18 Korea was right on: 4½ mice and "the ace of Mac flying sims." It's outstanding in many aspects.

But the best part of a fighter sim is going up against human counterparts. This is where GSC lost that half a mouse. The networking code has been very poor. It runs well only if you go head-to-head with a single person. GSC states that up to four players can fly together, but this is not true under the current circumstances. Playing with four people has never been stable.

During Apple's hard times, GSC was forced to expand into the PC world. Hornet 3.0 and Korea are now available for PC—with TCP/IP protocol for better multiplayer action! GSC has been promising a release for a TCP/IP patch upgrade over the last year but has failed to come through. I, and others like me, feel that GSC has let down the Mac community, and many have chosen to boycott them. What a shame.







# The Vision Thing

# The Ascent of Mac

THE IMAC ISN'T SIMPLY ABOUT STYLE; IT'S ALSO ABOUT EVOLUTION

OR YEARS, ANTHROpologists have said that the tools a society uses say a lot about that society—its level of technical development, its priorities, even its values. Some have even gone so far as to say that it was the advent of tool usage that kicked hominid evolution into high gear.

Certainly, we've all seen what tool selection can say, rightly or wrongly, about an individual. What do you first think about someone stepping out of a Porsche 911 versus a Dodge Caravan? Now, consider this: it could easily be the same person who just happens to own both.

I was recently reminded of this when reading an article that attributed the iMac's popularity primarily to the cute-and-cuddly factor. This article seemed to say that the only thing iMac customers were concerned with was how good the computer was going to look in their living room.


Forget how insulting this conclusion is; it also misses the point. While it's true that iMac buyers probably like the look of their little blue (green, red, purple, or—my personal favorite—orange) wonder, the majority of them bought it to solve a problem: getting on the Internet. According to Apple's buyer research, over 80 percent of all iMac buyers bought their computer for this purpose, and 66 percent were online in the first day. They didn't buy an iMac because of how fast it was or even because of what operating system it ran. They bought it because it solved a problem.

### The Nature of Tools

At their simplest level, tools solve problems. Our progenitors first threw stones to kill prey. Later, as tool usage became more sophisticated, the stones were tied to the ends of sticks and used as clubs. As we stopped being nomadic and developed agriculture, club handles got longer and the stones flatter and the hunting tool became a hoe for tilling the fields.

I'd venture a wild guess that early humans didn't at any point worry about whether the club head was made by Intel or IBM, or if the hoe ran Windows. What they were looking for was the best tool to get the job done; and by best, they meant the one that got the best results with the least amount of effort.

I believe that when most new users (in other words, those not already sold on the Mac) consider buying an iMac, they first consider whether it will do the job. Then whether it will do it simply. And finally whether it will do it well. They don't spend a lot of time pondering the



things that those of us who bought computers in the first and second wave of computer adoption worried about: processor speed, operating system, RAM, and disk size.

It's not because these so-called thirdwave buyers are simpletons but because they realize something fundamental about today's computers: they're all really fast, with plenty of everything. As long as the computer can run a Web browser, it doesn't matter if one operating system has 10,000 applications available for it while the other has only 5,000. What matters is how simple it is to set up, how easy it is to use, and how efficiently it can get the job done.

### Your Perfect Mac

The fact is, even today's most sophisticated users are less interested in specsmanship. While a few years ago benchmark charts and detailed technical specifications would have been all that experts needed to make their buying decisions, today even *they* yawn when they see that the latest G3 minitower tops out at 400MHz. They don't want to know only how fast or powerful that new Mac is—they want to know what that extra power


does for them. They want to know what problems can be solved with that extra oomph.



# Adobe Unveils a New Acrobat

ACROBAT 4.0 ADDS NEW FEATURES FOR PRINT PROFESSIONALS

crobat, Adobe Systems' portable-document technology, has shown a split personality in recent years, serving as an easy way to place publications online, and also as an alternative to PostScript for print production. With Acrobat 4.0, the latest release, Adobe has bolstered both aspects of the software with an assortment of features that make the technology more flexible and easier to use. However, Mac users will find less to like than their PC counterparts, because some of the most interesting new features will be available only in the Windows version. The software is scheduled to ship this spring.

Acrobat 4.0, which will sell for \$249, consists of Acrobat Distiller, for converting Post-Script files into Portable Document Format (PDF) files; Acrobat (formerly Acrobat Exchange), for modifying and annotating PDF files; and Acrobat Reader, a cross-platform utility for viewing PDF files that Adobe also offers for free download. Along with the



new software, Adobe has introduced an update of the PDF specification that allows for the extraction and editing of text and graphics in PDF files.

Flexible Graphics Mac users will most appreciate Acrobat's new graphics-production features. With Acrobat 3.0, you were limited to making simple text edits in a PDF file. With the new version, you can modify the font, type size, and other type attri-

butes in addition to the text itself. This lets you correct errors in a PDF file without going back to the original application that created it, an especially useful feature if you plan to send the files to a service bureau for high-resolution output.

You can also edit bitmapped images and vector graphics within PDF files. In Acrobat's Preferences dialog box you specify an image editor, such as Adobe Photoshop, and a vector drawing program, such as Adobe Illustrator. When you click on an image in a PDF file, Acrobat launches the appropriate graphics software; when you're finished editing the image, the modified version appears automatically in Acrobat.

Perhaps a bigger boon for print-production pros is the ability to embed ICC color continues

profiles within PDF files, making the format more amenable to color management. Acrobat 4.0 also supports new graphics-production features in PostScript 3, including Smooth Shading for color blends and Device N, which lets you save duotones, tritones, and six-color images in PDF files. By itself, Acrobat still cannot generate color separations from PDF files, but you can create separations using Crackerjack, a \$495 Acrobat plug-in from Lantana (510/744-0282, www

.lantanarips.com). The maximum page size is now 200 by 200 inches.

Optimized PDF Acrobat 4.0 makes it much easier to create files for different purposes by letting you choose one of three presets: Screen Optimized for online viewing, Print Optimized for printing from a local ink-jet or laser printer, and Press Optimized for output on a commercial press. Screen Optimized corresponds to the default settings in Acrobat 3.0; it downsamples all images to 72 dpi

and converts them to RGB. In addition to these canned settings, you can create a custom setting and place it in a hot folder; when you drop a Post-Script file into the folder, Acrobat Distiller automatically converts it to PDF using the options you've specified.

As an alternative, Acquired Knowledge (619/587-4668, www.acquiredknowledge .com) has introduced a \$79 Acrobat plug-in called EZ-PDF that creates Mac OS Desktop Printer files that incorporate custom PDF settings. You simply print to the appropriate Desktop Printer to produce a PDF file with the options you want. The program, which also works with Acrobat 3.0, automatically generates a PostScript print file prior to generating the PDF file.

For workgroups, Adobe has added features that make it easier to annotate PDF files. Previous versions let you add electronic "sticky notes" to the file. With the upgrade, you can also type short comments directly on the page, highlight or strike through text, mark up the document using a digital pencil or other

tool, or apply a virtual rubber stamp.

Short Shrift? There are many new features here, but PC users get even more. The Windows version of Acrobat 4.0 includes a Web capture function that lets you quickly convert Web sites into PDF files; a digital-signature feature that identi-

fies the document's author for authentication purposes; and macros for creating PDF files from Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. The Windows version also lets you extract formatted text, graphics, and tables from PDF files;

the Mac release is limited to extracting unformatted text and graphics. Adobe, responding to early complaints from Mac users, says it will add the PC-only features to a future update of the Mac version. PDF files created in Windows can still be read with the Mac version of Acrobat Reader.

# Adobe's Software Bonanza

IT'S BEEN A BUSY MONTH FOR ADOBE SYSTEMS. IN addition to introducing Adobe InDesign (see the feature "Adobe Answers XPress," elsewhere in this issue) and Adobe Acrobat 4.0, the company has announced new versions of CyberStudio and PageMaker and has also revealed its long-range plans for PageMill, whose fate was in doubt after Adobe's recent acquisition of Cyber-Studio developer GoLive.

Adobe has rechristened GoLive CyberStudio as Adobe GoLive and plans to ship version 4.0 for the Mac by the time you read this. Adobe also plans to release the first Windows version of GoLive, which was previously available only for the Mac, sometime in the second quarter. The \$299 Web authoring software has become a favorite among professional designers and has received two consecutive Macworld Eddy Awards.

The upgrade—originally slated as CyberStudio 3.5 before Adobe acquired the product-is a modest one, offering an improved QuickTime 3 Movie Editor, enhanced XML support, new site-management functions, and a handful of other features.

Adobe has also decided to continue offering its PageMill Web authoring software as an entry-level complement to GoLive. GoLive had offered its own entry-level program, CyberStudio Personal Edition, which was essentially an early version of CyberStudio.

And if you thought InDesign signaled the death of PageMaker, think again. Adobe, positioning its classic page-layout software as a midrange program for corporate users, has announced PageMaker 6.5 Plus, which adds templates and other design aids to the package.

Adobe has also announced PressReady, a \$149 color-management program that transforms inexpensive ink-jet printers into PostScript 3 proofing devices. The company expects to ship the product by midyear.—STEPHEN BEALE

Hewlett-Packard (HP; 800/ 752-0900, www.hp.com) has launched its first serious challenge to Epson, with a pair of new USB printers.

Epson Rolls Epson's new Stylus Color 900-successor to the Stylus Color 850-uses the same variable-dot printing technology that Epson introduced in the Stylus Color 740. However, the four-color printer features a smaller dot size-three picoliters, versus six in the earlier model-and also offers faster print speed: up to ten pages per minute in color. Targeted at business users, the printer will sell for an estimated street price of \$449. Epson also offers a networked version, the Stylus Color 900N, for \$649, Both models include USB and serial ports for Mac connectivity.

Along with these desktop printers, Epson has unveiled its first true large-format model, the Stylus Pro 9000. The six-color printer, which will sell for \$7,995, or \$12,995 with an optional EFI Fiery server, uses roll-fed media up to 44 inches wide. Features include high-capacity ink storage and an optional take-up-roller system. With the Fiery server installed, the printer offers PostScript 3 output and Ethernet and LocalTalk connections.

In addition to targeting the printer at poster- and signmaking applications, Epson sees it as a viable option for fine-art output.

HP Moves Meanwhile, Hewlett-Packard is making its first serious moves in the Mac ink-jet market after announcing last summer that it would offer printers for the iMac. The new four-color Desklet 882C and DeskJet 895C each feature a built-in USB interface and offer image quality vastly superior to that of HP's DeskJet 697c, which the company released for the iMac last fall. Both new printers offer a maximum resolution of 600 dpi and an 8-by-10.5inch image area. The 882C sells for \$299; the 895C, which is faster and includes networking capabilities, sells for \$399. HP has been shipping Windows versions of the

printers for several months; the company plans to release models with Mac drivers by the time you read this.

# New Cameras Double the Megapixels

NIKON LEADS THE WAY WITH \$1,000 MODEL

wo-megapixel digital cameras have been around for several years in the form of professional models that sell for \$15,000 to \$30,000, but now they're ready for the masses. Nikon (516/547-4381, www.nikonusa.com) and Olympus (516/844-

5000, www.olympus.com) have announced \$1,000 cameras that offer resolutions of 2 million pixels or more, and Agfa (978/658-5600, www. agfa.com), Kodak (716/724-4000, www. kodak.com), and Canon USA (516/ 328-5000, www.usa .canon.com) have announced models that fall just short of

2-megapixel resolution. Other companies are likely to follow.

Cool Pixels Nikon's CoolPix 950 and CoolPix 700, which capture images on a newly designed 2.11-megapixel CCD, offer a maximum resolution of 1,600 by 1,200 pixels. They each ship with an 8MB CompactFlash card and work with the auxiliary lenses currently available for the CoolPix 900. The \$999 CoolPix 950 features a 3× optical zoom, while the

\$599 CoolPix 700 is limited to digital zoom. A Best-Shot Selector feature, designed for shooting in moving environments, captures five frames, analyzes the image frequencies, and then automatically discards all but the best shot.

The C-2000 Zoom, from Olympus, includes a 2.1megapixel CCD-good for 1,600-by-1,200-pixel resolution-and 3× zoom capability. An infrared remote lets you take pictures from a distance. Other features include a fourmode flash and a choice of 100, 200, or 400 ISO filmspeed equivalency. The camera stores images on Smart-Media cards; an 8MB card is included in the package. Olympus expects to ship the camera in May.

For photographers with fatter wallets, the Dimage RD3000 from Minolta (201/ 825-4000, www.minolta.com) offers a 2.7-megapixel CCD, generating images at a 1,984-

by-1,360-pixel resolution. Minolta expects that it will sell for \$6,000 to \$7,000.

Plust Shy Agfa's new ePhoto CL50 lacks a 2-megapixel CCD but uses PhotoGenie software to boost resolution from 1.3 to 1.9 megapixels. The camera offers 1,600-by-1,200-pixel, 1,280-by-960-pixel, and 640-by-480-pixel resolution and lets you tag shots you want to convert into panoramic vistas. You can continues

# USB Readers Play the Cards

NEW PRODUCTS LET YOU READ SMARTMEDIA,

COMPACTFLASH CARDS

pple's iMacs and the recently introduced blue Power Macs G3's —lacking the familiar serial port—pose a challenge if you want to download images from a digital camera. Even if your Mac has a serial connection, transferring pictures to your hard drive can be painfully slow. Fortunately, there are alternatives: San-Disk (408/542-0500, www.sandisk.com), Newer Tech-

nology (316/943-0222, www newertech.com), and Microtech (203/482-9402, www microtechint.com) have introduced inexpensive USB devices that can quickly transfer images stored on Compact-Flash or SmartMedia cards, the most popular storage media for digital cameras.

For cameras that store images on CompactFlash cards, SanDisk's \$89 USB ImageMate—currently shipping—transfers images at up to 750 Kbps. Another CompactFlash option is Newer's \$99 uFlash CF, which downloads images at 900 Kbps. For cameras that use SmartMedia cards, Newer's \$89 uFlash SM offers the same transfer rate. Both Newer readers are scheduled to ship by the time you read this.

Not sure which media you'll be using? Microtech's \$89 USB CameraMate reads both. Set to ship by the time you read this, the Camera-Mate can download images from CompactFlash or Smart-Media cards at up to 1.2MB per second.

The matchbook-size CompactFlash cards, which can store up to 48MB apiece, work with digital cameras from Kodak, Agfa, Nikon, Epson, and other companies. Cameras that support SmartMedia include models from Toshiba, Olympus, and Fuji. The cards, which are much thinner than CompactFlash media, hold up to 16MB each.

# **New Directions for Quark**

FACING A POTENTIALLY STIFF CHALLENGE TO ITS flagship page-layout program, Quark (800/326-3946, www.quark.com) has offered a preview of QuarkXPress 5 as well as several new page-layout programs aimed at specialized publishing segments, such as package and catalog design. The challenge, of course, comes from Adobe Systems, whose new InDesign software is targeted squarely at QuarkXPress (see the feature "Adobe Answers XPress," elsewhere in this issue).

Quark won't say when it expects to ship Quark-XPress 5, but the company has identified four broad functions that you can expect in the upgrade: a built-in table editor, document layers, HTML export, and PDF import.

The new table editor, in addition to letting you specify the appearance of rows and columns, will permit the import of text or graphics into cells. You'll also be able to apply blends to the table background.

The layers function will let you place text and graphic elements on separate layers that can be hidden, merged, and modified in other ways. For example, you'll be able to specify how different layers interact with each other when wrapping text; if you have text on one layer, a circular graphic on a second layer, and a rectangular image on a third, you'll be able to see how the text would look when wrapped around either graphic.

A new Articles palette will let you identify elements within a document that should be included in a Web page. You can then export those elements in HTML format, with the option of mapping the document's style sheet to specific HTML tags.

The PDF import option will let you drag and drop a PDF file into QuarkXPress, where it will appear as a graphic object.

Quark also plans to release a set of stand-alone page-layout applications targeted at specialized design and publishing segments. One such product, codenamed Wrapture, will be a page-layout and prototyping program aimed at package designers. In addition to providing specialized design features, Wrapture will include 3-D-modeling and -rendering functions that let you see how the package will look in its final form. Based on early demonstrations, it appears that the simulations will have a high degree of realism: you'll be able to prototype transparent-plastic package elements and place multiple packages on a virtual store shelf to see how they will look in a retail setting.

Quark is also developing a workflow-management and layout application, code-named Cypress, for catalog publishers. A forthcoming Web-site-production program, code-named Troika, will let you extract XML data from QuarkXPress documents and will also include tools for designing Web templates.—STEPHEN BEALE



## **Adobe After Effects 4.0**

COMPOSITING

POWERHOUSE BEEFS UP

After Effects 4.0 after a threeyear wait, and longtime users will find this the most attractive upgrade in the product's history. Although it still doesn't achieve perfection, version 4.0 offers major new capabilities and a significantly improved interface, with enhancements that reflect the needs of real-world users.

#### **Push Those Pixels**

Both flavors of After Effects, Standard and Production, let you combine still images with movie files, giving you a myriad of options and a fine degree of control. The Production bundle—which targets professional tasks such as compositing 3-D elements onto a livemotion background—ships with a considerably larger selection of visual and audio filters, better tools for advanced compositing tasks, and more-robust keyframe-manipulation options. The two versions are virtually identical otherwise, and users can share projects between them.

You'll first notice the improvements in version 4.0 when you import content from Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop, or Premiere. After Effects fully supports Photoshop's Adjustment Layers, Layer Effects, and layer-transfer modes (including those new to Photoshop 4.X and 5.X) in imported Photoshop documents. The



program also supports layered Illustrator documents and some of the features new to Illustrator 8, such as Gradient Meshes. Each layer can have up to 128 associated masks, sufficient for even the most maniacal masking adventures.

In a surprising move on Adobe's part, After Effects also lets you import Premiere projects directly, albeit with the expected limitation: because it doesn't support Premiere's special-effects filters and transitions, you must re-create them after you import the project. This improved support for native file formats,

although far from sexy, is an important and practical addition for production professionals, and it greatly streamlines animation projects.

The program's interface, although largely unchanged from earlier versions, better accommodates serious work and brings After Effects in line with the interface standards Photoshop and Illustrator have set. You can now use color coding to distinguish layers and parameters in the Timeline window, and markers let you jump quickly to specific spots on the timeline. Tabbed, rearrangeable windows

make it easy to customize control-screen configurations, a nicety we've grown accustomed to in Photoshop.

One of the biggest drawbacks of working with earlier versions of After Effects was the inability to evaluate a project's results without resorting to an external playback program such as Apple's MoviePlayer. Now, given enough RAM, After Effects can render a project directly into memory and play the movie with full-motion quality. A 320-by-240-pixel movie can play in near-real time on a lower-end Power Mac; G3 owners can play NTSC-resolution video at 30 fps (available RAM limits the length of clips). This is a boon to pro animators and novices alike; the sheer number of parameters you can control in After Effects means that you need to see a reasonable representation of a layered composition's actual rendered playback speed.

#### **Effectual Effects**

After Effects has always been a laboratory for special-effects experimentation, and version 4.0 takes the toys to a whole new level. The new distortion tools, for warping and reshaping, are smooth and organic; for example, you can use the Reshape filter to stuff someone's face into a soda bottle or use the Warp filter to make a movie look like it's playing on a sheet of pliable rubber. In fact, used creatively, these filters (along with animated opacity settings for layers) offer a somewhat labor-intensive but very workable approach to morphing-an effect that typically requires a dedicated program.

Another addition is Adjustment Layers, which (unlike their Photoshop counterparts) let you apply any effect filter in After Effects-not just color-correction tools-to multiple layers simultaneously. This astounding feature significantly streamlines the otherwise tedious process of applying filter effects to multiple layers. Instead of applying a blur filter to 20 separate layers by hand, you can simply create a new Adjustment Layer, apply the Blur filter to it, and position the Adjustment Layer directly over the desired layers; this automatically applies the blur filter to all underlying layers.

Another new feature (in the Production bundle only) is Particle Playground, which appears to be a basic particleanimation system until you start to explore it. Despite the constraints of After Effects' 2-D realm, a robust physics sim-

ulation is going on under the hood of this plug-in. For example, if you've brought a rendered 3-D logo with an alpha channel into After Effects, the particles you create with Particle Playground can interact with the logo in some surprising ways. When a particle stream hits the edge of the logo's alpha channel, particles can bounce off the logo, change color, slow down, and speed up. In addition, you can use any layer (including type) as a source for the particle shape, opening the door to slick animated-type effects that haven't been feasible on the Mac until now.

Other new drawing tools let you create basic shapes such as ellipses, but you still can't paint directly on video clips. You can generate animated titles and text with the Basic and Path Text tools, which offer fully animatable kerning, baseline spacing, tracking, and "jitter" functions.

In the realm of video production, editors don't live by pictures alone; audio is sometimes more than half the battle. Although After Effects 4.0 doesn't render external audio editors obsolete, it offers significantly enhanced audio processing overall, with new equalization and tone controls in both editions of the program. Experienced and new users alike will be delighted with the real-time audio scrubbing: to play audio tracks, simply hold down the # key while dragging the cursor in the timeline. That makes it easy to place keyframes so they synchronize precisely with sound, and it's perfect for music-video and postproduction jobs.

But After Effects' best audio-filter enhancements are in the Production bundle, with its new filters for adding echo, flanging, modulation, and equalization effects. You'll still want to do your industrial-strength editing in a separate audio-processing program, but these additions are welcome nonetheless.

#### Wish List

The single most obvious omission in After Effects 4.0 is the lack of an integrated z space, a crucial feature for a wide array of multidimensional layering effects. For example, creating a commercial special effect-such as a flock of video displays floating toward a distant horizon and casting shadows on one another-is a tedious process,

especially if you want to combine the video planes and the rendered 3-D elements with any degree of realism. The included Basic 3D plug-in is just thatbasic-and although third-party alternatives help, they can't match true, integrated z-space functionality.

After Effects' render-management capabilities, although noticeably improved for single-project output, still don't allow you to render multiple projects as a batch. (The workaround is to put all your render projects into a single project file.) And many of the cool new special effects appear only in the Production version; the Standard version has no distortion tools, not even a Twirl filter. The special-effects plug-ins aren't even available as an option with the Standard version. Third-party developers offer a spectrum of specialeffects plug-ins, but it would be nice if Adobe offered incremental upgrades to the Standard version.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Adobe After Effects 4.0 is a solid upgrade and a natural choice for anyone getting into the field of motion graphics. Become an expert in After Effects, and someday you just might see your name in the credits of some galactic space extravaganza on the big screen .- DAVID BIEDNY

OST QUICKTIME MOVIES ARE passive affairs, played from start to finish; they're really little more than digital versions of videotapes. Totally Hip Software's LiveStage 1.0.1 and Electrifier's Electrifier Pro 1.0 have the potential to change that. These authoring tools tap into QuickTime's ability to combine multiple media and enhance them with interactivity. But although Electrifier Pro and LiveStage show great promise, both programs feel like works in progress.

#### Common Ground

Mirroring the versatility of QuickTime itself, both Electrifier Pro and LiveStage have innumerable applications. On one level, they let you create QuickTime movies containing clickable hot spots (which link to Web pages) and navigation buttons, complete with rollovers. With either program, you can create the kind of visually engaging Web-navigation screens commonly associated with Macromedia Flash and Shockwave. If you're planning to add QuickTime content to your site anyway, now you can take the next step and build your navigation mechanisms around QuickTime, too; the same plug-in that handles your site's conventional movies can handle its navigation schemes as well. Indeed, given that its installed base is larger than Shockwave's, Quick-Time may now be a better choice for some interactive Web projects.

On another level, both programs let you combine a multitude of QuickTime media formats. You can add soundtracks to QuickTime VR scenes, add bandwidth-friendly vector graphics to conventional movies, and create movies containing still images that slide across the frame while MIDI soundtracks play.


Both programs also support Quick-Time's built-in special effects, including fire, clouds, scratched movie film, and color tinting, plus such transitions as dissolves and wipes. These goodies are built into QuickTime, so you can create exotic effects—such as a pond that ripples when a user clicks on it—with virtually no increase in file size.

Because these programs produce

QuickTime movies, you can play your projects on a Mac or Windows computer using Apple's MoviePlayer utility. You can also embed them in any QuickTime-savvy document, from a Web page to a Microsoft Word file to an Adobe Acrobat document. Try that with Macromedia Flash or Shockwave.

Finally, both programs need better documentation; their manuals are supplied only in electronic form and, worse, are poorly organized and light on tutorials.

Each program arrives at these parcels of common ground in its own way. Electrifier Pro offers a drag-and-drop authoring environment and direct support for

virtually every media type QuickTime supports. But it also has a steep learning curve, one that's made even steeper by the poor documentation and a sometimes confusing interface.

In contrast, LiveStage relies on a built-in scripting language for interactivity and supports only some of Quick-Time's media types. LiveStage also isn't as versatile as Electrifier Pro, although its scripting language allows you to create projects that Electrifier Pro can't handle.

LiveStage comes with WebPainter 3.1, an animation program Totally Hip sells separately for \$70. Version 3.1 builds on its predecessor's solid feature set by adding a vector text tool, an improved magic-wand tool (now with adjustable tolerance), and enhanced animation features.

#### Importing and Designing

In Electrifier Pro, you do most of your work in a single document window that sports three tabs: Layout, Preview, and Structure. The Structure tab is a timeline view denoting the duration of the imported media elements, which Electrifier Pro calls actors (see "Interactive Authoring").

You can import items by using menu commands or simply by dragging and dropping them from the Finder. Electrifier Pro can import QuickTime movies and every QuickTime-supported media type as well as Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator files. You can also add Quick-Time data tracks, each of which can hold

media elements and can be selectively shown, hidden, and animated during playback.

In LiveStage, you must add elements to the Library palette before you can import them, a cumbersome process compared with Electrifier Pro's drag-and-drop approach. LiveStage supports all Quick-Time still-image and audio formats, but it can't import QuickTime movies themselves. You read that correctly: LiveStage creates interactive QuickTime movies and gives you full control over Quick-Time movie tracks, but it does not let you add existing Quick-

Time movies to a LiveStage project. To create a project that controls a QuickTime movie—for example, to add a panning soundtrack to a QuickTime VR panorama—you must use Apple's MoviePlayer. It's an awkward process that can make testing and debugging a project far more time-consuming than necessary.

Both programs offer layout views for designing a project. In Electrifier Pro's Layout mode, you can position elements, change their front-to-back stacking order, and add text and effects. The Inspector palette lets you specify precise positioning and change an element's ink characteristics (to make an element's background transparent, for example).

Electrifier Pro's layout aids are of only fair quality. You can have objects snap to a grid, whose dimensions you can specify, but you can't display the grid. Worse, you can't use the keyboard's arrow keys to nudge an item's positioning in single-pixel increments. LiveStage's layout features are similarly lean; although the program does support arrow-key nudging, it lacks a snap-to grid.

#### Implementing Interactivity


Once you've imported media elements, you can specify interactivity and animation—making images glide across the screen, creating buttons that link to Web pages, and so on.

In Electrifier Pro, you add interactivity in either the Layout or Structure mode, generally by dragging an action icon from the Modifiers palette onto the element you want to modify and then specifying the action's parameters in the Inspector palette. To have an element invert when the mouse rolls over it, for example, you drag the Set Ink action to the element and then specify the Reverse Ink and Mouse Over Begun events in the Inspector palette. If you've used the now defunct mTropolis, you'll find Electrifier Pro's approach similar although not as elegantly implemented.

Electrifier Pro's 18 actions run the gamut from changing ink modes to opening URLs to changing the pan settings of a QuickTime VR movie; the program's 21 effects range from volume adjustment to path animation to spinning, slanting, and zooming. Building a project in Electrifier Pro is a process of adding tracks, importing media into them, combining modifiers and actions, and then arranging the elements in the Structure view. But although the overall concept is fine, the execution is lacking. For example, to change some effects' parameters, you have to choose a different effect and then choose the original effect again just to access its options.

In LiveStage, you add interactivity by writing scripts in its built-in programming language, QScript. Working in LiveStage's Objects window, you specify actions (such as Mouse Enter and Mouse Click) and then attach scripts to those actions (see "Scripting QuickTime"). You can peck out scripts by hand or assemble them by dragging and dropping keywords from the QScript Reference palette.

QScript is a rich language, complete with control structures (such as if...then and while); local and global variables;

arrays; and actions that control the playback of various types of QuickTime tracks, including VR, music, sound, and video tracks. It gives you far more control over interactivity than do Electrifier Pro and Macromedia Flash. Indeed, one of the demonstration files that accompany LiveStage is a simple Space Invaders—style video game. When you realize that this game is a QuickTime movie that can be embedded in virtually any application, the power of QuickTime as an interactive platform really hits home.

But QScript is a programming language, and you'll need time to master it. Unfortunately, its syntax bears little resemblance to that of other popular languages, such as Macromedia Director's Lingo. And Director 7 comes with a large library of canned scripts that handle common tasks; LiveStage doesn't.

#### Previewing and Publishing

Both programs let you preview your efforts before creating the final movie. In Electrifier Pro, clicking on the document window's Preview tab causes the project to run. It's fast and convenient.

In LiveStage, you have to compile your project. While the project is compiling, LiveStage checks the scripts for errors and prepares a preview. The process doesn't take long—five seconds or so, depending on the project—but it makes troubleshooting and debugging more cumbersome.

When you've finished a project in either Electrifier Pro or LiveStage, you can output it as a stand-alone QuickTime movie. Electrifier Pro also lets you export a project's animation as an animated GIF file and its audio as a WAV or AIFF file.

Even though both Electrifier Pro and LiveStage are naturals for Web-destined projects, neither can create an HTML file containing the <embed> tags necessary to include your movie in a Web page. Both programs could use features similar to those of Macromedia's After-Shock, which accompanies Director and creates the HTML necessary to embed Shockwave projects.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Electrifier Pro is the better program for projects that

involve enhancing existing QuickTime content and for anyone averse to scripting. (Version 2.0, due out by the time you read this, will support the streaming features of Apple's QuickTime 4.) LiveStage is the better choice for applications involving animation and requiring the sophisticated branching capabilities of QScript. Both prove that creating a powerful authoring environment involves more than simply combining interactivity features with a layout screen; it also takes a user interface that makes authoring approachable and even enjoyable. You'll find this attention to detail in the latest versions of Macromedia Director and Flash. When Electrifier and Totally Hip start sweating those interface details, QuickTime's potential as a platform for interactivity will finally be realized .- JIM HEID

## Kai's Power Tools 5

#### ADOBE PHOTOSHOP PLUG-IN PACKAGE IS A MIXED BAG

Adobe Photoshop special effects, Kai's Power Tools (KPT) has long been a leader in the realm of "golly-geewow" filters, evoking both admiration and ire from legions of users. The latest incarnation from MetaCreations, KPT 5.0, offers a few new standout filters, such as the ShapeShifter, but overall adds

less to the mix than did previous upgrades. Fans of earlier versions will likely find at least a few gadgets that bring smiles to their faces, but designers who had little use for KPT in the past will be even less likely to convert.

#### A Pixel Piñata

KPT 5.0 does not update the filters of the previous version, KPT 3.0. Instead, you get a Macintosh/Windows CD-ROM with ten new plug-ins plus the full set of KPT 3.0 filters.

Some of the new plug-ins build on core Photoshop functionality—and provide significant speed enhancements—but with unusual omissions. For example, KPT Blurrrr contains a fast blurring algorithm (calculated with greater precision than in Photoshop's built-in equivalents) and offers a wide range of blur distortions, such as a Spiral Blur, which makes an image look as if it's being sucked into a vortex, and Gaussian Wave blur, which adds a cool sparkle effect. However, the Zoom Blur filter, while much speedier

than Photoshop's Zoom Blur, doesn't let you reposition the blur's center point, a frustrating and seemingly arbitrary limitation. On the other hand, you can change the center point in the new RadWarp filter, which produces fish-eye lens effects.

The ShapeShifter plug-in, sure to become a favorite with Web designers, makes it easy to produce beveled, textured buttons and logos. Rendered environ-

> ment maps and lighting controls turn any selection into a dimensional object, with basic shading and shadows.

> Another useful addition, KPT Smoothie, is designed to smooth edges and remove noise in poorly scanned images, especially line art. However, you cannot preview the processed image against any background layers, a limitation that partially defeats the purpose of edge smoothing.

You can get the same effect by using Photoshop's blur filters and Levels command; this is more tedious but allows you

to evaluate the results while viewing all layers in the image.

#### Wild Fractals

Fans of previous KPT versions are sure to love the FraxExplorer, a fractal generator that includes new fractal styles, as well as tools for manipulating color maps in real time. The filter's "wow" factor is substantial, but fractals have already been overused by designers and thus have become visual clichés. On the other hand, the Noize plug-in is a great starting point for creating neat textures, nicely complementing Photoshop's simplistic noise filters.

Our personal favorite, Frax4D, lets you create bizarre—and gorgeous—3-D fractal shapes, which you have to see to comprehend. Small changes to the controls yield wild, often unpredictable shapes in the preview area, which updates quickly and can be rotated almost in real time (see "Frax to the Max").

The resulting imagery may not be especially useful—it would be great if the

3-D shapes could be saved as DXF files—but the filter is fun enough to be almost addictive.

The other new filters in the package are KPT FiberOptix, which creates glowing strand effects; KPT Orb-It, which generates a series of spheres; and KPT FraxFlame, which produces a variety of sweeping lighting effects.

#### Interface Alert

As in previous versions, the KPT 5 filters take over your entire display, replacing the familiar Photoshop workspace. Professional Photoshop artists may object to KPT's interface dictatorship, and the time needed to load the screen elements can grate on your nerves. However, more playful hobbyists and visual artists might enjoy the experience.

We liked the lighting interface found in some of the filters, and the real-time bevel previews in KPT ShapeShifter are great for designing type effects.

KPT's printed documentation consists of a single quick-reference card, with the user guide implemented as a series of Adobe Acrobat PDF files on the CD-ROM. You can launch Acrobat Reader from within KPT, but the appropriate PDF file for the current filter does not automatically load; instead, you must open the file after running Acrobat Reader.


The documentation, while not bad, could use a greater number of examples. However, this is partially offset by the wealth of presets for the filters, which give you a decent starting point for your own experimentation.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

You already know if you want Kai's Power Tools 5. Photoshop artists who didn't care before won't care now. Fans of previous versions will instantly love the new toys, and it's a no-brainer if you don't already have version 3.0. KPT 5 could be more filling, but it tastes great if you like colorful candy.—DAVID BIEDNY

## Kai's Photo Soap 2

#### IMAGE EDITOR IMPROVED BUT STILL FLAWED

OWADAYS, YOU CAN'T THROW a rock in a computer store without hitting an inexpensive flatbed scanner or digital camera. If you've been throwing such rocks and are new to digital imaging, Kai's Photo Soap 2 might be just what you need in order to perform simple edits and color corrections and to get your images printed or posted on the Web. A vast improvement over Soap 1, version 2 includes new retouching and painting features and powerful Website–creation tools. But although the program's interface is much improved, it is still needlessly obtuse and difficult to use.

#### Shamefaced

Although Soap 2 is targeted at less experienced users, you need a beefy Mac to comfortably use it. The normal installation eats up 120MB of storage, and the program's graphics-heavy interface demands at least a fast 603e CPU.

Soap 2 has abandoned its predecessor's "rooms" metaphor in favor of a tabbed interface that lets you freely move among the cataloging, retouching, compositing, and printing facilities. Dropping the old modal approach is a great improvement, in that you're no longer confined to a particular workflow.

Unfortunately, Soap 2's interface improvements don't go far enough. The interface is aesthetically pleasing and sports some clever graphics, but like other MetaCreations programs that include the "Kai" moniker (see "Kai's Power Tools 5," elsewhere in this section), Soap is non-intuitive and difficult to use. For example, the program has separate Input and Output menus rather than a single File menu; at the very least, Soap needs some standard conventions in its menu system. Tool labels or context-sensitive help would also be nice. The manual is a necessity, but it's available only in the form of PDF files.

When you launch Soap, it presents the Organizer page, which lets you browse and arrange image thumbnails. You can import pictures from folders or directly from a scanner or digital camera.

Soap 2 lets you add searchable keywords to images, making it easy to sort and arrange files. However, we'd prefer searches that simply selected found images instead of changing their position on the desktop. We'd also like to see a flipping command and additional rotating options; currently you can rotate only 90 degrees clockwise. But the versatility and impressive speed of the Organizer make it a good tool for cataloging images.

The Organizer's most noteworthy feature is HTML export. After you've arranged your images, you can choose Export to HTML to automatically create a Web page that looks exactly like the Soap desktop.

Folks viewing the page can rearrange the thumbnails or double-click on them to see a full-size image. The pages are small and fast, but we experienced compatibility problems with older browsers.

#### Retouching


Soap's image-editing tools, scattered across several rooms in the initial release, are now all in one place. From the Soap 2 Clean page, you can adjust colors and paint on, clone, or retouch images. Soap 2's color-correction tools are powerful and easy to use, thanks to a "graphic equalizer"-style interface. Corrections can be applied to an entire image or brushed in selectively with a range of brush and eraser tools.

New to version 2 is the ability to use Adobe Photoshop-compatible filters. Like other effects, Photoshop filters can be brushed on, something you can't do in any other program. This is a feature we'd love to see in Photoshop itself.

Performance on the Clean page is a bit slow, because the computer reloads a copy of the image each time you add an effect. Although we were comfortable running the program on a Power Mac G3, a slower computer might not fare as well.

Soap 2 includes a compositing facility that lets you bring in multiple images to create collages. You can rotate and reposition images and adjust opacity uniformly, or selectively with brushes. Unfortunately, Soap 2 provides no transfer modes between layers.

Once you've retouched your image, you can prepare it for printing in the Output section, which is Soap's greatest

strength. In addition to printing individual images, you can choose from a robust collection of album templates to package your pictures and captions. Although this sort of thing is often cheesy, Soap's albums and frames are well designed and attractive; even the most jaded graphics-head will be impressed.

Unfortunately, Soap's captioning tools are a bit of a disaster. Offering only three type sizes is bad enough, but the program's text tool doesn't automatically wrap words within a frame, forcing you to manually figure out where to place carriage returns to fit the text.

Once you've set up your album, you can print it out or export it as a Web site.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Users who want a quick and easy way of creating impressive print or Web presentations of their photos will be well served by Soap 2. However, although there is power in Soap's retouching tools, the interface continues to make them too difficult to use. We're pleased with the changes from version 1; hopefully version 3 will show equal improvement.—BEN LONG

winding path, emerging more than ten years ago from Silicon Beach Software, moving to Aldus and then to Allegiant Technologies, and now settling down with IncWell Digital Media Group. Along the way, SuperCard has gone through periods of dormancy and uncertainty, but IncWell's

first update brings the software up to speed with current Macintosh technologies at a price that can't be beat.

SuperCard is often described as "HyperCard done right." Like Hyper-Card, it uses a card-stack metaphor for organizing information. In SuperCard, cards appear in standard Mac OS windows and contain graphics, buttons, and text fields, all of which you can script to provide custom interactivity and functionality. You do your scripting in SuperTalk, an extended variation of HyperTalk, HyperCard's English-like scripting language.

Although SuperCard clearly derives from Apple's ever-aging HyperCard, don't let this lineage put you off. Super-Card has always offered integrated color capabilities, still missing from Hyper-Card. It supports bitmapped images and vector graphics, which it treats as fullfledged objects just like buttons and fields.

The program's forte is interactive multimedia. It supports audio, animation, and media playback in ways that are easier to script than in Macromedia Director. SuperCard projects can work like standard Mac programs, offering custom menus, palettes, and tool bars.

To this potent mix SuperCard 3.5.2 adds a handful of new features, plus complete compatibility with Mac OS 8.5 and support for key Macintosh technologies such as drag and drop, the Appearance

Manager, and QuickTime's new image formats. SuperTalk can also manipulate QuickTime VR movies, recognize spoken phrases via PlainTalk Speech Recognition, and manage scripts written in languages, such as AppleScript and Frontier's UserTalk, that conform to Open Scripting Architecture (OSA).

#### **One-Eyed Jacks**

Some of SuperCard 3.5.2's enhancements are welcome and successful. SuperCard's speech recognition and Quick-Time VR support worked surprisingly well, allowing us to

pan a QuickTime VR movie using voice commands. Similarly, combining Super-Card's new drag-and-drop capabilities with QuickTime's extensive graphics support made it easy to create a utility that opened image files, added a copyright notice, and then exported the result to another folder as a JPEG image.

However, some of SuperCard's new features don't go far enough. The program's support for OSA languages is awkward—a real shame, since strong Apple-Script capabilities would be valuable for creating utilities and prototype applications. Although you can run AppleScriptcreated scripts from SuperCard, you cannot use AppleScript to create or interact with SuperCard objects.

Authoring a SuperCard project has always been a modal experience: you're either authoring a project or running it. SuperCard 3.0 introduced the Project Editor, an extensive interactive editing environment within SuperCard. The Project Editor's features overlap—but don't completely replace—those of

SuperEdit, a separate application that formerly served as SuperCard's primary editor. Thus, the SuperCard authoring environment has become a hybrid, with overlapping functions scattered across two separate software modules. The Project Editor window is finally resizable and supports standard text-editing key combinations, but you can edit only one script at a time. However, you can edit multiple scripts in SuperEdit. You will find extensive, mostly accurate documentation and a useful on-screen SuperTalk language reference. However, the manuals are Acrobat PDF files-more than 1,600 odd-size pages' worth-unsuitable for printing or easy on-screen use. Printed documentation isn't available.

You can play back SuperCard projects using SuperCard itself, or convert them to stand-alone runtime applications with surprisingly down-to-earth system requirements: depending on your project, even decade-old 680X0 systems may run it with aplomb.

SuperCard is also jammed with tools for Internet deployment. The program can save projects in a format suitable for use with the Roadster Web browser plugin, which supports a substantial subset of SuperCard's functionality.

Allegiant Technologies introduced Roadster more than two years ago, and IncWell promises a forthcoming update. Unfortunately, this perpetually unfinished software is currently the only option for running SuperCard projects on the Windows platform.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

SuperCard's animation features can't compete with Macromedia Director's, but the software is well suited to producing multimedia projects that deliver complex interactivity and content management—all with the standard Macintosh look-and-feel. Even better, SuperCard 3.5.2 is now available for less than half the price its previous owners charged. For experienced scripters and authors, that's too good a deal to pass up.—GEOFF DUNCAN

## Freeway 2.0

WEB-SITE EDITOR HITS CRUISING SPEED

SoftPress Systems' Freeway showed promise (see Reviews, February 1998), but it lacked many common features found in competing professional-level products, such as GoLive CyberStudio and Macromedia Dreamweaver. Freeway 1.0's main strength was its close adherence to the QuarkXPress interface, making it easy for desktop publishers to transfer their layout and design skills to the Web. Freeway 2.0 maintains that easy familiarity but adds new features that cover most of the bases the first version missed.


#### This Road Looks Familiar

As in the previous version, you start by creating master pages containing elements shared across your site's pages, such as banners and navigation bars. As with QuarkXPress, you draw boxes that act as containers for text, graphics, and multimedia; the boxes can snap to guides or grids for easy alignment of page elements. An HTML Rectangle tool lets you create boxes to hold body text, which you import by either opening the text file with the Import command or dragging and dropping text into the Freeway document from the Finder or another application. Other tools let you link and unlink text flows from one text box to another, and Inspector palettes give you detailed control over page, text, and graphic elements.

One big concern of designers is control over typography, and Freeway 2.0 does an excellent job of making sure the type you see is the same type your site's visitor sees. As in the previous version, you can convert styled, editable text into a GIF or JPEG that's automatically antialiased against the page's background color. New to the program is support for Cascading Style Sheets (CSS), which give you real typographic control over HTML text. A unique compatibility mode produces pages that use HTML 3.2 markup tags as much as possible, reserving CSS tags for those styles that absolutely require it; the result is pages that work better in older browsers. (Freeway creates internal style sheets for individual pages, but not external style sheets for whole sites.)

#### Filling In the Potholes

Considering that the last version of Freeway didn't even support tables, Freeway 2.0 has gone a long way down the road toward supporting the latest Web standards. Table support has arrived, and it's quite good; you can even select and format the contents of noncontiguous cells. The program now supports frames, and you can convert existing pages into frame sets. Fixing an annoying omission in the first version, Freeway now lets you use text, not just graphics, as anchors, and you can wrap HTML text around in-line items such as images and tables.

As with the previous release, you can position objects precisely using invisible tables, but you now also have the option of using CSS layers. You can only move layers in a straight line; if you need greater control over page elements (using timelines and keyframes), you're better off with Dreamweaver or CyberStudio.

Freeway 2.0 implements JavaScript through Actions, libraries of code routines you select from a menu. The program comes with 15 Actions, including button rollovers, layer movement, and browser redirection. Unique to Freeway are Slave Actions, which activate multiple Actions from a single trigger. For example, you can have a single rollover change several images. The manual includes a tutorial for writing your own Actions, and you can download more

Actions from the SoftPress Web site.

The Freeway 2.0 CD-ROM offers spelling dictionaries for English, Spanish, French, German, Italian, and other languages, along with the 4.0 versions of Netscape Navigator, Netscape Communicator, and Microsoft Internet Explorer.

#### No Tinkering under the Hood

Because SoftPress has added HTML import to Freeway's repertoire, you can now import single pages or entire folders as sites. Unfortunately, the import facility isn't as accurate as it needs to be; when we imported a site originally created in CyberStudio (one that looked fine in browsers), several pages required significant touch-up to correct poor text alignment and spacing.

If you like the smell of raw HTML in the morning, Freeway may disappoint

you—it lacks an HTML mode where you can see and tweak the code. You can add some extra tags manually to the head or body sections via a dialog box, but that's no substitute for a real HTML editor. To be fair, SoftPress aims specifically at those designers who don't want to delve into the code behind the pages any more than they would want to tweak the PostScript output from a desktop publishing program.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

If all you want to do is create Web pages and never deal with

code, Freeway 2.0 is a worthy choice—especially if you're familiar with Quark-XPress. And if you bought a previous version of Freeway, the upgrade is free. Now that it supports tables, frames, JavaScript, and CSS, Freeway rivals CyberStudio and Dreamweaver in visual layout capabilities, though it can't match its competitors' HTML editing modes and superior sitemanagement tools. After a slow start, Freeway is up to speed.—TOM NEGRINO

## QuarkXTensions


FIVE USEFUL—BUT COSTLY—ADD-ONS FOR QUARKXPRESS

UARKXTENSIONS CAN BE great for enhancing your use of QuarkXPress, but sometimes you have to wonder if they're worth the hundreds of dollars you need to spend beyond the price of the original package. The five QuarkXTensions reviewed here are useful productivity aids, but with one exception, they may be too expensive for most print designers.

Gluon's \$99 Cloner and Badia Software's \$40 Duplica—the one reasonably priced product in this roundup—both make it easier to copy items within QuarkXPress. Cloner lets you copy items from one document to another existing document, a new document, or a different page range within the same document. Though it has a simple, self-explanatory interface, most QuarkXPress users will find \$99 too much to pay for such a one-trick pony.

Duplica, a more sophisticated product, lets you use Quark's built-in Duplicate, Step and Repeat, Copy, and Paste functions to copy almost any text, box, or line attribute to another location. For example, if a text block has a 1.5-point keyline, 50 percent blue background, and left text alignment, you can copy just those attributes to a different text block. As you copy items, you can rotate, reverse, or manipulate them in other ways. The intuitive design of this XTension, and its thorough and clear documentation, make it a worthwhile addition for many QuarkXPress users.

If you want to bring your Quark-XPress documents into other programs,

Gluon's \$189 XPressImage lets you convert a page or selection into TIFF, EPS, JPEG, GIF, or PDF files. However, we had problems with PDF export: when we used the default settings, the PDF document's text was bitmapped, with jagged edges, and image quality was poor. Considering the \$189 price tag, this Quark-XTension is useful only if you must frequently convert your QuarkXPress pages into graphics.

It's even harder to justify the \$225 price tag for Gluon's QC, which inspects your QuarkXPress documents for a wide range of common problems, including ones related to fonts, styles, and image formats. Unlike preflight programs, which check documents only after they're ready for transmission to a service bureau, QC inspects your QuarkXPress files on the fly as you're creating them. It's practical and easy to use, but even after continual on-the-fly analysis, you may still want to run the document

through a preflight program, because QC does not collect all the project elements together for output.

For those who want to rescue bad QuarkXPress files, Markztools III is a \$199 utility suite that covers the most common corruption problems in the QuarkXPress program. Convert Document lets you open and convert higher-version documents-such as those created in Ouark-XPress 4.0-from within an older version of the software. Salvage does a good job of opening damaged QuarkXPress files, including those that generate "Bad File Format" or "Unexpected End of File" errors when you try to open them. Scavenge Text is a last resort for bad files, allowing you to extract text if you can't open the file itself. The Verification module ensures the integrity of your document with each incremental save. Save to Temporary File, a handy backup utility, creates a temporary copy of your document in a designated folder each time you save the original. Gray Previews helps keep file sizes small by converting full-color previews into gray-scale images. Finally, Version Keeper adds two pieces of information to the title bar: the current document version number and the amount of memory available to QuarkXPress.

Overall, Markztools III is simple and well conceived. It can be a godsend if you have damaged files, but like most of the other QuarkXTensions covered here, it's costly, given its narrow range of functions.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Each of these QuarkXTensions is useful, and they all work as advertised. But any add-on that costs more than \$100 should give a buyer pause. Is avoiding a few extra clicks of the mouse worth *that* much? The answer depends on your own specific priorities.—ANDREW SHALAT


## **Connectix Virtual Game Station**

PLAYSTATION GAMES COME TO THE MAC

HE NUMBER OF MAC GAMES IS growing, but it's still relatively small compared to the wealth of games available for the PC. Connectix's Virtual Game Station (VGS) 1.1 opens up the vast library of Sony PlayStation titles to G3 Macs—including the iMac—using impressive technology that emulates a PlayStation's hardware, including its MIPS RISC processor. Be prepared for occasionally sluggish game response, though; this is emulation, after all.

When you insert a PlayStation disc into your Mac, VGS launches automatically. Thanks to the G3s' 24× CD-ROM drives, games load faster under VGS than they do on the PlayStation's 2× drive.

In VGS's minimalist user interface, the main window lets you create and select virtual memory cards—which, like real PlayStation memory cards, you use

for saving game states. It is also where you configure input devices and set the volume for VGS, eliminating the need for trips to the Monitors control panel.

Although you can use a keyboard as an input device, PlayStation games are clearly designed with a game pad in mind. We found that the Gravis Gamepad Pro USB, with button placement identical to the PlayStation controller's, made the VGS experience much more like using a PlayStation than like using a computer (although we missed the PlayStation's analog game pad in some games).

The downside of emulation is always that it's, well, emulation; it's never as good as the real thing. VGS 1.1 is no exception. Connectix admits that it has tested VGS only with the most popular games of the past year or two, so it's no surprise that some games work better than others. Although our test games were generally quite playable, we did hit some snags. Playing Konami's Metal Gear Solid on a G3/300, we found the response slow during intense action, compared to playing it on a real PlayStation. We had similar experiences with Sony's Crash Bandicoot 2 on an iMac 233MHz.

It was easy to overlook the occasional sound dropout in Sony's Spyro the Dragon and minor graphical glitch in Psygnosis's G-Police, since both games played well otherwise. Shiny's MDK was the only game in our test suite that wouldn't play at all; it consistently got stuck shortly after starting.

Connectix stresses that VGS runs only on Power Mac G3's; it doesn't support older machines with upgrade cards. VGS requires a fast system bus, as well as one of the CD-ROM drives in recent Apple systems so it can verify that the discs it plays are not pirated copies. We tried running VGS on a Umax S900 outfitted with a Newer Technology G3 upgrade card, and CD-ROM-compatibility issues foiled multiple attempts to load a game. Some accelerator vendors claim their cards are compatible with VGS, but don't be surprised if the performance isn't what you expect.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Connectix's Virtual Game Station is an impressive piece of technology that runs most PlayStation games well, even though it has a few compatibility quirks. The delayed response we saw can make games that require split-second timing much harder to play. Although it's unlikely that VGS will supplant real PlayStations, Mac owners who already have PlayStations are almost certain to want it.—STEPHAN SOMOGYI

## 8×CD Recorders

SPEEDY CD-RS ARE HERE, BUT MEDIA LAG

NEW GENERATION OF CD recorders is here: the 4× and 6× recorders that seemed so fast six months ago have given way to 8× devices that can burn a recordable CD in less than nine minutes. The first 8× recorders to hit the Mac market, Smart and Friendly's CD Rocket and APS Technologies' APS CD-R 8×20, both deliver on the promise of faster writing speeds at prices comparable to what you recently would have paid for a 4× recorder. However, given the shortage of

high-speed recordable media and some minor reliability problems with the new drives, you may be better off sticking with a slower mechanism—at least for now.

#### Tweedledum and Tweedledee

The APS drive features a more compact enclosure and a neat automatic-termination feature, but it doesn't ship with a SCSI cable. The Smart and Friendly drive costs an extra \$200, consumes more desk space, and requires manual termination but includes a SCSI cable and a terminator. Otherwise the drives are identical: they use the same 8×20 mechanism from Sanyo and include the same CD-recording software, Adaptec Toast 3.5.

The Sanyo mechanism writes recordable CDs at up to 8× and reads all common CD formats at up to 20×. But to write a CD at 8×, you need media certified for the higher speed—and at the moment only a handful of vendors are offering 8×certified discs (see "Media Limited for 8× CD-Rs," News, April 1999). You can buy certified discs directly from drive ven-

dors—at \$20 per ten-pack—but finding them at a local outlet may be a challenge.

A 20× mechanism for reading CDs sounds impressive, but you need a fast SCSI connection to take advantage of that speed. On a Power Mac 7300 with a standard SCSI port, the drives were slower than the internal 8× CD-ROM drive. The drives also mysteriously failed every 15th disc or so; error messages indicated problems with the SCSI connection or the servo-tracking mechanism. And although the recorders feature a 2MB buffer, you'll still need a reasonably fast hard disk to feed them a continuous data stream.

The Toast software is easy to use and lets you write discs in a wide range of

CD formats. A companion program, Toast Audio Extractor, lets you copy tracks from an audio CD to your hard drive. However, Toast automatically inserts a 2ms pause between audio tracks. If you're recording an album on which the music doesn't pause, this causes what sounds like a skip between songs.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

Both drives sell for under \$700 a far cry from the CD Rocket's original \$1,090 price tag when the drive was released last year for the PC. But that's still about \$200

to \$400 more than what you'd pay for a 4× drive. If writing a CD in 9 minutes rather than 18 makes a big difference to you—and you're willing to put up with a temporarily limited media supply—then consider the more reasonably priced APS drive.—STEPHEN BEALE

### EditDV 1.5

AMAZING BUT CHALLENGING DIGITAL-VIDEO EDITOR

Radius, was among the first companies to capitalize on the thrilling possibilities of digital video (DV). Equipped with the company's MotoDV FireWire card and a digital camcorder (available for under \$900), your Macintosh can duplicate the functions of a video-editing workstation that would have cost \$20,000 in 1995. Digital Origin's newly updated EditDV is an Adobe Premiere-like program for assembling DV clips into a finished movie. Like

any newborn, this baby has plenty of messy moments, but you can easily see how attractive it might be when it grows up.

Although they're digital, DV camcorders still record onto tapes. But as the data flows into your Mac (and out again after editing), there's no loss of quality, no matter how many times you shuttle footage back and forth. The finished movies look stunning, always full-screen and 30 frames per second, with none of the shrunken, washed-out look of analog-captured QuickTime movies.

The beauty of EditDV 1.5 is that it puts the capturing and editing functions in a single program, but reaching video nirvana is still a mammoth project. You need a huge, fast hard drive (3.6MB per each second of video), 80MB of RAM, a TV, and a Digital Origin FireWire card (oddly enough, EditDV doesn't yet work with the blue G3s' built-in FireWire).

Once everything is connected, you can control your camcorder (play, rewind,

and so on) from your Mac's keyboard. You flag certain taped scenes as component clips for your movie; unattended, EditDV then turns all such segments into DV clips on your hard drive.

Now you're ready to make your movie. You can apply EditDV's astounding power—filters, transitions, chroma key effects, and so on—with impressive precision. The text animator runs rings around Premiere's, and you can easily change filter, title, and effects settings over time using keyframes.

Unfortunately, you reach all these features via an interface that's modeled after Avid's professional editing systems; if you're accustomed to Premiere, EditDV will turn your brain to mush. The main

problem is that EditDV often ignores the Mac's visual orientation. For example, the timeline window shows only the names of your clips, not thumbnails, and you can't adjust a clip's length by dragging its edges. Transitions are similarly frustrating. You can't move or stretch a transition clip by dragging; you must adjust transitions numerically.

The most maddening aspect of EditDV, however, is learning it. There's no online help, or even balloon help, in a complex interface cluttered with unlabeled icons; the man-

ual is a disaster; and Digital Origin's help line is a toll call, frequently busy, and staffed by sometimes underinformed agents.

#### Macworld's Buying Advice

If you're simply hoping to make the occasional video with your DV camcorder, be warned: EditDV is infuriating to learn and decidedly antivisual. But if DV editing is your career, and user-friendliness isn't your main concern, struggling to master EditDV will reward you with power and efficiency that leave Premiere in the dust.—DAVID POGUE

ON'T LET THE FRUITY FLAVORS fool you: Apple's latest iMacs offer more than just a new color scheme. Sure, the hot-selling consumer Macs are now available in strawberry, blueberry, grape, lime, and tangerine. But they also sport a faster processor, a larger hard drive, and a smaller price tag than the original iMac. There are no breakthrough technologies here, and the iMac still suffers from limited expandability and an unergonomic mouse. Nevertheless, Apple has taken the most popular computer of 1998 and made it even more attractive for homes and schools.

The original, Bondi blue iMacs sold for \$1,299 with a 233MHz G3 processor and a 4GB hard drive. The new, \$1,199 iMacs feature a 266MHz G3 and a 6GB drive. Apple has also eliminated the iMac's IrDA port and the undocumented mezzanine port, but otherwise the new model is nearly identical to the old ones. It comes with a built-in 15-inch, 1,024-by-768-pixel display; 32MB of RAM; a 24× CD-ROM drive; 10/100BaseT Ethernet; a 56-Kbps modem; an ATI Rage Pro graphics accelerator (with 6MB of SGRAM); and two USB ports. (The latest

233MHz iMac included a Rage Pro; the original 233MHz iMac used the slower Rage II.)

Macworld Lab testing found that the new iMac delivered predictable performance: a little faster across the board than the original iMac, but not as speedy as our 300MHz reference system (see the benchmark in the feature "Your Perfect Mac," elsewhere in this issue).

Aside from the extra speed, the new iMac has the same strengths and weaknesses as the old one. On the plus side it's easy to use, features a striking industrial design, and offers lots of computing power for the money. The new iMac also benefits from the wider availability of USB peripherals, which were somewhat scarce when the original model debuted.


But most of the commonly heard complaints about the original iMac also apply. The new iMac features the same hard-to-handle mouse, and there's no built-in removable storage; no PCI slots; and no serial, SCSI, or FireWire connections. The new iMac is even less expandable than the original, which included the undocumented mezzanine port on the flip side of the motherboard. Apple made it clear to developers that this port was off-limits—you can void the iMac warranty by using it—but at least two companies, Formac and Micro Conversions, have announced boards that




plug into the slot. Still, you can't blame Apple for dropping a port that it never intended for third-party use.

Macworld's Buying Advice The new iMac builds on the success of the old one with faster performance, a lower price tag, and, yes, a choice of five colors. It's an affordable entry into the next generation of Mac computing.—STEPHEN BEALE

## **Apple Studio Display**

MONITOR MIMICS NEW G3 DESIGN

HE FIRST THING YOU NOTICE about Apple's latest 17-inch monitor is the look: it sports the same curvy, translucent industrial design seen in the new G3 Power Macs. But don't let the pretty facade fool you. The monitor offers top-notch display quality at a decent—although not rock-bottom—price.

The 17-inch Apple Studio Display is based on Mitsubishi's Diamondtron aperture-grille CRT, which features a 0.25mm dot pitch. Aperture-grille tubes typically offer sharper image quality than shadow-mask CRTs, and this model is no exception. Screen quality is excellent, with crisp text and great color rendition.

With a 16-inch viewable area, the monitor supports resolutions of up to 1,600 by 1,200 pixels (although it's best suited for 1,024-by-768-pixel display). It offers a relatively modest 60Hz refresh rate at the maximum resolution, but you can boost this to 85Hz at the default resolution to avoid flicker. Push-button controls let you set brightness and contrast; they also allow you to access the on-screen menu system to set color temperature, horizontal and



vertical positioning, and other options.

The monitor—which at first glance resembles a blueberry iMac—is clearly designed as a companion to the new G3 systems. In addition to sharing their color scheme, it features a broad, three-legged tilt-and-swivel stand that can't sit comfortably on Apple's older desktop Macs.


Apple says that it has certified the monitor to work only with its Power Mac G3 systems—both the original models and the new blue-and-white designs. However, because the 17-inch Studio Display is a multisynchronous monitor with a VGA connection, you should be able to use it with any Power Mac model as long as you have a Mac-to-VGA adapter. For example, Macworld Lab was able to use the moni-

tor with a Power Mac 9500 equipped with iXMicro's Ultimate Rez graphics card.

This 17-inch CRT is one of three new monitors Apple is selling under the Apple Studio Display brand, the others being a 15-inch LCD and a 21-inch CRT. The 15-inch Apple Studio Display features a white-and-blue color scheme and a \$1,099 price tag but is otherwise identical to the \$1,299 LCD monitor Apple introduced last year (\*\*\*, "The World Is Flat," December 1998). Macworld will cover the 21-inch CRT, which sports a similar industrial design, in a future issue.

Macworld's Buying Advice This Apple Studio Display is certainly not the cheapest 17-inch monitor you can buy, but it offers crisp text and images, excellent color rendition, and easy-to-use hardware controls without breaking the bank. Owners of older Mac systems may run into technical-support problems because of Apple's official specs, but if you use a Power Mac G3, give it a good look.—STEPHEN BEALE



## Wacom PL-400

DRAWING TABLET BEEFS UP LCD SCREEN

Wacom's family of high-resolution, pressure-sensitive graphics tablets, the PL-400 lets you paint and draw directly onto an active-matrix LCD screen built into the tablet. If you've never felt comfortable writing on a tablet while watching your monitor, you'll immediately appreciate the natural feel of drawing directly onto the PL-400's screen. But despite the tablet's fine engineering and intuitive feel, the LCD's limitations for serious graphics work—combined with the \$3,000 price tag—make it a tough choice for most users.

The PL-400 is a definite improvement over the smaller PL-300 (see *Reviews*, February 1998). It offers a 24-bit, 13.3-inch screen that supports a resolution of 1,024 by 768 pixels, and it comes with a PCI video card; the PL-300 required a separate video card. And installation is simple: just insert the PCI video card into your computer, attach the external power supply and the tablet's cable to the card, and plug the serial cable into one of your computer's serial ports. The easily adjustable stand lets you tilt the tablet anywhere between flat and

upright. The software is equally easy to install and includes controls for adjusting everything from pressure sensitivity to monitor setup.

Unfortunately, the LCD's color reproduction is problematic. Despite the quality of the screen, the tablet's contrast and color




gamut are, as with any LCD panel, far inferior to those of a good monitor. And like any other LCD, the PL-400's screen has a limited viewing range; contrast varies greatly, depending on your viewing angle. Although you can adjust the tablet's angle to improve contrast, there's no way to tell which angle will yield the truest color reproduction.

Another problem is sluggish performance: although the tablet's refresh rate is high enough to produce a sharp, steady

image, the pen's slight lag time is disconcerting. And because there's a slight space between the drawing surface and the LCD screen, the tip of the pen doesn't appear to correspond precisely to the pixels on the screen. This is particularly annoying when you're doing fine, detailed close-up work.

Macworld's Buying Advice Wacom's LCD pen tablets offer the most intuitive way to interact with a computer-more accurate than a touch screen, more naturalfeeling than a regular tablet. But \$3,000 is probably more than you want to spend just to have a more comfortable tablet. And although some users won't be bothered by the PL-400's less-than-speedy pen performance, no serious graphic artist could ignore the color and contrast problems inherent in an LCD screen. If you spend most of your day painting or drawing, however, and you aren't concerned with superaccurate color, you'll find that the PL-400 delivers on its claims.—BEN LONG


## DeltaGraph 4.5

PICTURE YOUR NUMBERS

FEW YEARS AGO, DELTAGRAPH
4.0 received one of *Macworld*'s highest ratings (see *Reviews*, September 1996). Since then, statistics giant SPSS has acquired Delta-Graph and updated it to accommodate the Web and other changes in Mac computing, but it's still the best Mac program in its field.

DeltaGraph's objective is simple: it reads Microsoft Excel files (and most other common data formats) and turns them into better-looking charts than Excel can produce, with a richer selection of business presentation styles and scientific chart types (see "The Floating World"). The program also handles large data sets more gracefully than does Excel (the included compact version of Design Science's Equation Editor enhances scientific display), and its business presentation charts are cleaner and easier to modify than Microsoft PowerPoint's. To change any element of a chart's appearance, you just double-click on the element and make a few selections.

Also new in DeltaGraph 4.5 is the option to export Web-ready JPEG graphics and import Excel 97 and 98 files. It lets




The Floating World This nicely shaded bubble chart is one of more than 80 aesthetically optimized presentation styles in DeltaGraph 4.5.

you generate QuickTime 3 slide shows and data animations and adds a Pantone color-picker extension to guarantee color consistency in printed output. Convenient new multipurpose File dialog boxes echo the style of System 8.5's Apple Navigation Manager; new AppleScripts help you set up DeltaGraph as a networked "chart server" and automatically generate Web-based or printed reports. Version 4.5 also adds 11 new chart types: 3 styles of high- and low-close stock market charts, 2 kinds of intensity scatterplots, and 6 kinds of bar and column line-overlay charts.

These interface improvements were necessary to adapt DeltaGraph to intranet and Internet computing environments, and their implementation is glitch free. The new chart types aren't quite as impressive, however. Some welcome new types have odd defaults; for example, the Intensity Scatter and Paired Intensity charts open with a nearly useless bicolor intensity ramp, necessitating a bit of tweaking. Similarly, the linewidth default in various bar charts with line overlays is a nearly invisible rule that calls for another adjustment.

But to be fair, the controls for adjusting chart details are nicely arranged and easy to use, and serious users preparing charts for publication nearly always make extensive departures from the defaults.

Macworld's Buying Advice If it's your job to prepare charts for print or Web publication on a regular basis, it's time to step up to DeltaGraph 4.5 and leave the Excel-PowerPoint duo behind. You'll spend some time mastering DeltaGraph's details, but you'll be rewarded with a big payoff in better-looking charts.—CHARLES SEITER




## QuickDNS Pro 2.2

DOMAIN NAME SERVER IMPROVES WIZARDS, SECURITY

HE INTERNET DOMAIN NAME System (DNS) is big news these days, both because of the hotly contested changes in DNS policies and because it's turned out to be the linchpin of the Internet—without DNS, you can leave your surfboard at home. Men & Mice brought server-caliber DNS to the Macintosh with its original QuickDNS Pro, which offered Internet domain-name lookup robust enough even for heavily trafficked Web sites. Version 2.2 builds on that base by improving ease of use, performance, and security, boosting the Mac's credibility as a self-contained Internet server.

QuickDNS Pro is easy to install and includes an excellent online (PDF) user's manual. This version retains its predecessor's user-friendly interface, with wizards that lead you through the process of creating various DNS records. Alternatively, you can use the supplied batch-conversion tool to translate DNS records from a text-based DNS server, such as those bundled with Unix and Windows. The product also offers secondary DNS service and dynamic load

balancing, two features that enhance a Webserver farm's reliability.

New in this version is the ability to import records directly into the server via the administration application, streamlining the process of converting from another platform. Also new is a wizard that automates the creation of classless reverse domain files, a time-consuming and tedious manual process with traditional DNS servers.

This version adds an important security feature that prevents DNS spoofing, a technique for redirecting e-mail or other traffic from its intended destination to a hacker's server. You can also restrict zone transfers to specific secondary servers to further protect domain information.

Other new features give you control over the amount of detail in DNS activity logs and add performance improvements that take advantage of fast G3 processors. In tests against Apple's MacDNS (part of AppleShare IP 6.1), QuickDNS Pro delivered 150 times as many cached and noncached responses per minute as MacDNS. On a Power Mac G3/300 running OS 8.5, QuickDNS Pro easily kept up with Sun's Solaris Unix DNS server running on a 300MHz Intel box.

QuickDNS Pro still can't display the contents of the secondary domains it's serving, but it now includes a debugging tool, DNS Expert, which checks for consistency of DNS information across domains.

Macworld's Buying Advice If you want to avoid the tedium of Unix DNS administration, QuickDNS Pro 2.2 delivers all the performance you could want, plus a feature set that goes far beyond the DNS servers bundled with Unix and Windows.—MEL BECKMAN



## Dark Vengeance

HACK-AND-SLASHER HITS AND MISSES

NE OF THE YEAR'S MOST EAGERly anticipated games-Reality Bytes' Dark Vengeance (published by Mac-Soft)—has finally hit the shelves. Was it worth the wait? Yes and no. Kissing cousin to the Tomb Raider series, this third-person hack-and-slash game offers a more richly realized and expansive world than Lara Croft's, but brings a measure of frustration as well.

As with the Tomb Raider games, you spend most of your time looking at your



Room with a View This is just one of Dark Vengeance's richly appointed rooms.


protagonist's backside while propelling him or her through a labyrinth of levels, gathering goodies, and slaying the spiritually corrupt. The three heroes include Nanoc the Gladiator, a muscle-bound galoot whose strength allows him to wield large, cumbersome weapons; Kite the Trickster, a more agile character who dashes her enemies with lethal powders and other shortrange weapons; and Jetrel the Warlock, a bandage-swathed gentleman who prefers long-range weapons.

Your heroes can deliver blows in three ways: a quick lateral chop, a slower overhand hack, and a deadlier, backhanded slash. You can block your enemies' attack-unusual for such games. A sweeping graphic arc marks each thrust and parry-green if you or your enemy misses and a satisfying red when blood is drawn. The weapons are not the usual fare; Dark Vengeance's armory is packed with exotic weapons such as Living Flame—a Molotov cocktail you sprinkle on the baddies—and the Vampire Staff, which unleashes a pair of flesh-eating bats. Also unique is Reality Bytes' decision to include cheat codes as a menu item.

The world of Dark Vengeance under 3-D-acceleration hardware—ATI's Rage Pro or a 3Dfx Voodoo card—is beautiful, with its sumptuously colored walls and vast chambers. The software-rendered graphics aren't nearly as impressive as those in MacSoft's Unreal, however. The movement of the characters can be ungainly, and heroes tend to get snagged on jutting corners, barrels, and decorative statuary. And although no one expects such a game's story line to rise to the level of literature, not only is Dark Vengeance's plot convoluted, but the poorly written and occasionally mumbled dialogue makes it even more confusing. Finally, I prefer the bodies of the vanguished to remain visible rather than disappearing after a few seconds. Because the game lacks a mapping element, having familiar bodies scattered throughout the many corridors and halls would make it easier to retrace steps.

Macworld's Buying Advice Dark Vengeance is a beautiful and entertaining diversion that, due to some control problems and an unconvincing plot, doesn't quite live up to its potential. If Dark Vengeance II cleans up these problems, it will be a musthave game.—CHRISTOPHER BREEN







#### Maintaining a Legacy

ith the arrival of the iMac and new Power Macintosh G3 systems, Apple has left behind many of the conventions of computing in the 1980s. Gone are the serial and SCSI ports of old—faster, hot-pluggable protocols such as USB and FireWire are the flavors of Apple's future (see "The USB Connection," October 1998, and "iMac Envy," March 1999). But while USB and FireWire are promising, what are today's users supposed to do with their accumulated serial and SCSI devices?

Although Apple has moved on, other developers have stepped into the breach and are providing solutions for connecting old hardware to new Macintosh models. With the help of an adapter or two, your legacy hardware can live on to work another day.

#### Printers and Modems

Since all of Apple's current desktop models have 10/100BaseT on board, you won't have trouble using a printer that has Ethernet. However, if you have a LocalTalk or serial printer, you need an adapter.

Be warned, however, that some adapters don't work with all serial devices. For example, although Keyspan's (510/222-0131, www.keyspan.com) \$80 USB Serial Adapter allows you to connect certain modems and printers to your USB-compatible Mac, it doesn't support LocalTalk printers and networks, nor does it work with MIDI devices such as MIDI interfaces and synthesizers that include a serial port.

Griffin Technology's (615/255-0990, www.griffintechnology .com) iPort and gPort adapters, on the other hand, support not only standard serial devices, such as modems, but Local-Talk devices and MIDI as well. The \$80 iPort mounts inside the older iMacs and also provides an external video port (the iPort is currently not compatible with the multicolored 266MHz iMacs). Although the gPort doesn't provide additional video output, it does offer a single serial port. The gPort connects internally to the blue Power Mac G3's motherboard.

Farallon (510/346-8001, www.farallon.com) solves the serial/LocalTalk problem with an adapter for each—the iPrint LT and iPrint SL. Both of these devices, \$100 each (company's estimated price), allow you to print via your Mac's Ethernet port. The iPrint LT supports up to eight LocalTalk devices, including iMacs and G3's, and the iPrint SL allows you to print to an Apple StyleWriter.

#### Input Devices

One lonely ADB port remains on the blue Power Mac G3's, but it's completely absent from the iMac. If you'd like to use an ADB keyboard and mouse, buy Griffin Technologies' \$40

USB-to-ADB iMate adapter. And gamers should be on the lookout for the JoyPort USB adapter from Kernel Productions (302/456-3026, www.kernel.com). This \$50 device will allow you to connect Genesis, Atari, Sony PlayStation, and Nintendo 64 gaming devices to your USB Mac. By the time you read this, USB game controllers will also be available from Ariston Technologies, Saitek, CH Products, and Gravis.

#### Hubs

USB allows you to connect multiple devices to your new Mac, but to do so you need a hub-a box that bears several USB ports. One of the most interesting hubs is CompuCable's (714/557-5510, www.compucable .com) iDock. This handy \$200 iMac swivel stand carries a three-port USB hub, two serial ports, and a parallel port for PC printers. Reportedly, the iDock won't support Local-Talk, nor are drivers supplied for the parallel printer—those drivers must be obtained by the

#### SCSI

printer's manufacturer.

At press time, USB-to-SCSI converters were not yet available, but three of them should be on the shelves by the time you read this. Newer Technology (316/943-0222, www.newertech.com) is preparing the \$80 uSCSI; Microtech (203/483-9402, www.microtechint.com) is slated to ship the \$80 Xpress USB; and SecondWave (512/329-9283, www.2ndwave.com) is selling the \$79 ScusBee.

Be forewarned: before you buy one of these devices, be sure to consider their limitations. Data moves over USB at only 1.2 MBps—slower than the 5-MBps transfer rate of most Macs' external SCSI and far slower than any SCSI card. This means that not only will data move fairly slowly between your SCSI drives and your new Mac, but applications that require fast data transfer—audio- and video-editing programs, for example—may not be able to pull data quickly enough from these drives. Also, at least one of the manufacturers claims that its product is intended to work only with storage devices; SCSI scanners, for example, may not work with these converters. Although iMac owners will have to rely on such converters for SCSI support, Power Mac G3 users should simply add a PCI SCSI card.

#### Essentials for Every Mac

here are as many ways to build a perfect Mac as there are Mac users. But some products will enhance any Mac user's computing experience. For example, although Apple has become increasingly generous in its allocation of RAM and hard-drive space, we still feel that your computer can never be too fast. And while Apple provides a serviceable set of utilities, you can do better with the addition of a few troubleshooting, backup, and Internet tools.

Memory To Mac users of old, 32MB of RAM may seem extravagant. But in these days of memory-munching applications, it's barely enough to load the Mac OS and a word processor. Although additional RAM won't make most operations go any faster unless your Mac currently relies on virtual memory, it does allow you to open more applications.

Troubleshooting Apple's Extensions Manager is a good start, but it's not nearly as capable as Casady & Greene's Conflict Catcher 8 (\*\*\*\*\*\*; \$80; 831/484-9228, www.casadyg.com). There's simply no better tool for managing control panels and extensions, and it's also invaluable for tracking down crash-causing extension con-

flicts. If your screen is littered with extension and control panel icons when you start up, you need this utility.

Backup Regardless of how you use your Mac, you must back up your data, and a member of the Retrospect family can do just that—
Dantz Development's Retrospect 4.1 (\*\*\*\*\*\*; \$249; 925/253-3000, www.


.dantz.com) or Retrospect Express 4.1 (\*\*\*\*\*; \$50).

Removable Media Apple has shown the way: the floppy drive is dead. From all appearances its successor is lomega's Zip drive (\*\*\*\*, \$150; 801/778-1000, www.iomega.com). Despite the occasional reliability problems with these drives, the Zip provides



#### A Mac for All Seasons

The new Power Macintosh G3's have mastered the art of speed. All four minitowers outperformed the first-generation Power Macintosh G3/300MHz, with the G3/400MHz scoring the highest overall. The high Quake scores indicate that these systems are optimized for improved game play with the new ATI chip set. As you'd expect, the iMac 266MHz outperforms the 233MHz version. handy and relatively fast storage at a reasonable price. If it's not already installed, we'd add one to each of our recommended configurations. PowerBook users can add VST Technologies' PowerBook Zip (\*\*\*\*); \$249; 978/635-8200, www.vsttech.com).

Internet Utilities Although Apple bundles Microsoft's Internet applications, Internet Explorer 4.5 (\*\*\*\*) and Outlook Express 4.0 (\*\*\*\*), on all Mac models, there are additional Internet applications that every Mac should have. Given some Web sites' preference for one particular browser, it would be wise to install Netscape Communicator 4.5 (\*\*\*; free; 650/254-1900, www.netscape.com) on your Mac. Likewise, Simon Fraser's MT-News-Watcher 2.4.4 (free; www.best.com/~smfr/mtnw/) is an excellent newsgroup reader. And if you need to employ FTP services, download a copy of Stairways' Anarchie Pro 3.5 (\*\*\*\*); \$35 shareware; www.stairways.com).

System Enhancements To navigate around your Mac more easily from within Apple's limited Open and Find dialog boxes, buy a copy of Power On Technology's Action Files 1.1 (\$50; 612/317-0344, www.actionutilities.com).


#### THE LAST WORD

When it comes to finding the perfect Macintosh, you're the best judge of which Mac provides you with all the necessities and fits your budget at the same time. However, certain home truths must be considered when deciding which Mac you should buy. If you're working with high-end graphics and video, you need the fastest Mac on the planet, complete with as much RAM and hard-drive space as you can afford. The entry-level Power Macintosh G3 is a smart business buy, but if you're working on the go, consider a swift PowerBook G3. You'll find no greater bargain in the Apple universe than the iMac—perfect for the home or dormitory. And the enthusiasts just need enough power and exotic peripherals to keep them entertained until Apple begins shipping the next generation of processors.

And there you have it in a single, neat package—the Mac you should buy, the configurations you should consider, the core applications you should have for the work you do and games you play, and numerous suggestions for simultaneously enhancing your Mac and draining your bank account. The Mac you purchase will certainly have the Apple logo affixed to it. But the rest is up to you. **m**

#### INDESIGN CHALLENGES

#### QUARK'S PAGE-LAYOUT SUPREMACY

# ADBERS ANSWERS XPRSS

f you're a professional publisher or designer, chances are you put food on your table by using QuarkXPress, Adobe Photoshop, and perhaps Adobe Illustrator. For quite a while, Adobe has wished you'd switch to an all-Adobe diet, but the company's page-layout program, Page-Maker, has failed to attract high-end publishers. That may be about to change. Macworld got a chance to work with a prerelease version of Adobe Systems' (408/536-6000, www.adobe.com) newest and brightest hope for taking back the page-layout crown. The program—codenamed K2 and now officially known as Adobe InDesign—is expected to ship this summer with an estimated street price of \$699. From what

we saw, InDesign promises to at least give professional publishers pause to think, and may offer them a real alternative to QuarkXPress for the first time in years.

#### First Impressions

Let's get one thing straight: InDesign is *not* an upgrade to PageMaker. Adobe will release PageMaker 6.5 Plus this summer at an estimated street price of \$499. This refocused application will be chock-full o' wizards, templates, and clip art and will be aimed at the (mostly Windows) business and consumer markets. So what is InDesign?

It's a brand-new page-layout program, built from the ground up. (Notably, it will work only with Mac OS 8.5 and later, to some users' chagrin.)

The first thing you'll notice is that this is clearly an Adobe program—from the familiar Navigator palette to the layout of the Tool palette (see the screen shot "The InDesign World"). As you look more closely, though, you'll also observe elements of Page-Maker and QuarkXPress, with a strong dash of Illustrator too.

Some PageMaker traits are absent. For example, you lay out InDesign pages much as you do QuarkXPress designs, on a large pasteboard. InDesign's Control palette—command central for making changes to items on your page—is broken down into three palettes: Transform, Character, and Paragraph. It also lacks PageMaker's ability to alter every setting in the palette using keystrokes (although it contains more settings than the one in QuarkXPress). PageMaker's long-document features such as indexing are also missing.

InDesign does appear to have some of the flexibility that Page-Maker users have always crowed about. For example, the program lets you place text and graphics on the page with or without drawing a frame first. Still the big news is not how similar this program will be to PageMaker but how it might meet, or exceed, the features designers have come to know in QuarkXPress.

#### It's the Little Things

InDesign doesn't introduce many new big-and-flashy features to desktop publishers. Where it appears to shine is in attention to small but important features, removing many of the frustrations that have long plagued users of both Page-Maker and QuarkXPress. (For a more complete list, see the sidebar "Ten Great Features.")

Timesaving Touches A simple example of InDesign's attention to detail is the program's unlimited number of undo's, which will free you to experiment with designs as you can in many other apps. Similarly, InDesign lifts some other barriers that Quark-XPress users have learned to work around, such as the inability to anchor a box outside a column of text or to move a box past the edge of the pasteboard. InDesign will even spare you the hassle of having to choose whether a frame is for a text block or a picture: frames are always generic until you put something in them.

A Tamer of Troublesome Text InDesign's text features will appeal to designers and production people tired of the drudgery of manual copyfitting and kerning. The Multi-line Composer feature can calculate hyphenation and justification settings by examining an entire paragraph (or as many lines as you specify), instead of just a single line, to create better-looking text (see the screen shot "Better-Set Type"). In the process, it notably reduces the amount of manual tweaking necessary and will be especially helpful if you're trying to avoid multiple word breaks in a design with awkward text wraps. Similarly, the program's Optical Kerning feature does its best to find optimal character spacing, even if you've mixed different type sizes and faces. The program's text-linking features are also quite well designed (see the screen shot "New Linking Scheme").

A Clear View Taking a cue from Photoshop, InDesign will offer one feature that will probably become a favorite of many desktop publishers: the ability to open multiple views of a document. This means that you'll be able to zoom in on some type you're formatting in one window while seeing how your changes affect the page design as a whole in another window.

#### A Whole New Approach

You can't really see the most revolutionary aspect of InDesign, a feature of the program that ensures its future competitive potential: it's almost completely modular. That means most of the tools and features will be based on plug-ins and shared libraries. At first glance this is pretty dull news, but it has several important effects.

Powerful Plug-in Possibilities Third-party plug-in developers will have an unheard-of amount of power to create new features and change existing ones. Don't like the InDesign interface? Change it. Need to connect the program to a mainframe database? No problem. Have your own proprietary hyphenation schemes? Great—plug 'em in. In fact, many QuarkXPress XTension developers have already started developing for InDesign, including Extensis, a lowly apprentice production, and Em Software.

Quick Fixes Adobe will be able to update existing features (and eradicate the inevitable bugs) quickly. You'll even be able to set a built-in preference in InDesign to check periodically for new updates on Adobe's Web site and download them automatically.

Supremely Scriptable Just about everything in the program can be automated with AppleScript (on a Mac) or Visual Basic (in Windows). The ability to automate tedious and complicated tasks in QuarkXPress has long been one of the program's key advantages for professional users.

#### The Big Switch

All of this sounds great, but the real question is, will Quark-XPress users make the switch? Adobe certainly is going to try to make the process as painless as possible.

Familiar Surroundings As a longtime QuarkXPress user, I was immediately pleased by InDesign's customizable keyboard shortcuts. The product will ship with a complete set of shortcuts that match the ones in QuarkXPress, making the transition between applications much less time-consuming. Similarly, many of InDesign's dialog boxes and menu items will be comfortably familiar to QuarkXPress stalwarts.

Perhaps most important, InDesign will be able to open QuarkXPress documents (from versions 3.3 and 4.0) and retain the majority of the documents' formatting, so you won't have to


- magnify an EPS file and see its contents instead of viewing only an inexact bitmapped preview. (In fact, you won't even need to save previews with EPS files anymore, which means smaller files.)
- 2. Typographic Controls InDesign will be able to apply hyphenation and justification based on a whole paragraph rather than just line by line. Plus, optical kerning and optical margin alignment (even better than hung punctuation) will help you create great-looking type.
- **3.** Character Styles The ability to apply styles at the character level is quite powerful. QuarkXPress 4.0 lets you do this, but in some ways InDesign will offer greater control.
- 4. Bézier Paths Although drawing Bézier curves for lines and frames is fun, the ability to copy or drag paths from Illustrator and then edit them is truly useful. InDesign will also recognize embedded clipping paths in images or create them on the fly.
- **5. PDF Support** The rumor that InDesign's internal file format would *be* Adobe's Portable Document Format (PDF) isn't true. Nonetheless, InDesign will offer extensive support for PDF, including the ability to read and write files without the help of Acrobat Distiller. This is great if you need to place PDF files in your document or do minor edits, but don't expect to reconstruct an entire PDF document.
- **6.** Language Support InDesign will ship with dictionaries and hyphenation rules for most European languages and will even be able to set the language for a single word in a paragraph. In addition, it will be Unicode compliant, so you can open files from the Japanese version of InDesign (although you won't be able to edit the text fully).
- **7. Nesting Objects** You will be able to paste a rectangular text box inside an oval frame, place that group inside some text that has been converted to paths, and then still go back and edit the original text or text box with the direct-select arrow tool.
- **8.** Guides and Grids You will be able to quickly build a grid of guides on your page, or even place or position a single guide numerically.
- **9.** Consistent Imaging Model Because Adobe is building the same imaging model into all its programs, you should get significantly more-consistent color and screen display among Illustrator, Photoshop, and InDesign. You will also be able to place Illustrator and Photoshop files in your documents without first saving them as EPS or TIFF files.
- 10. Better Master Pages You will be able to quickly turn a document page into a master page, and even build master pages that are based on other master pages (so a change on one master page can ripple through several others).

#### Little Steps, Big Payoff

There's not enough space in this article to describe *all* the features that will be in the upcoming InDesign, but here are some other extras that might make a difference to you.



File-Type Freedom Gone are the days of converting all your images to TIFF and EPS before placing them. InDesign can accept native Illustrator, PDF, and Photoshop files. (Layers automatically get flattened in Photoshop files.) You can even do low-level editing of Illustrator and PDF files within the program.




New Linking Scheme InDesign's elegant text-linking feature gives you quick feedback about which way your text is flowing by assigning each text frame an "in-box" and "out-box."



Artistic Bonuses You can apply a gradient to text without losing the ability to edit that text freely—you can even edit Bézier points in your drawing files.





Better-Set Type In the Before shot, InDesign calculated line breaks in the traditional way—by applying settings one line at a time—with mediocre results. In the After shot, the Multi-line Composer considered different line-break schemes across multiple lines to get better-looking justified type.

re-create your templates from scratch. Of course, it's still too early to tell just how well the program will do the conversions.

Potential Pitfalls On the other hand, some of InDesign's features may be confusing to QuarkXPress users. In general, the program's illustration features appear to be similar to those in QuarkXPress 4.0, with the important exceptions that you won't be able to put text on a path and there are only basic merge features for combining multiple paths. But some of the ways these features are implemented may trip up Illustrator-ignorant users. For example, there are Stroke and Fill boxes in the *main* Tool palette, which will make little sense to some people since this is a page-layout program. The version we looked at also defined and applied colors in a way that will be unfamiliar to people who live and breathe QuarkXPress. For instance, the current beta version of InDesign doesn't support the building of multi-ink colors (inks that are a combination of other spot-color inks), an easy task in QuarkXPress.

#### The Last Word

If you've worked in publishing for a while, you remember when PageMaker and QuarkXPress would periodically leapfrog each other in features and usability. Those were exciting days when we all had a lot to look forward to each time a new version hit the shelves.

It doesn't look like InDesign 1.0 will represent a quantum leap over QuarkXPress 4.0 when it ships, but the program will offer some exciting new features that will raise the bar for page-layout pros. Multiple undo's, the ability to display high-resolution vector EPS graphics at any magnification, and powerful typographic controls will whet the appetite of PageMaker and XPress users alike. We'll have to wait for the review to see who will be victorious, but one thing is clear—this summer Adobe will be back in the fight. **m**



## MODEMS'LAST STAND

What do records, eighttrack tapes, and floppy
disks have in common?
All three are gadgets that
served us well in their
time but have disappeared
from everyday use
because more-efficient
devices have replaced
them. Believe it or not, it's
almost time to add analog
modems to that list.

ANALOG MODEMS WILL SOON BE OBSOLETE— HERE IS WHAT'S NEXT While 56K modems are on their way out, they're definitely not dead yet. Modems still are essential for faxing and remote access from hotels and other outback locations. No matter who you are, you'll likely still have a 56K modem in your life for the foreseeable future. That's why, in addition to testing today's digital technologies, Macworld Lab tested five 56K modems to find which one is the best (see the sidebar, "The Last Modem You'll Ever Buy?").

But we also wanted to make sure you're prepared for a telecommunications future that's becoming more real every day. Which high-speed technology should you choose? Each of these three fast Internet technologies has its own particular strengths and weaknesses—not all of them may be available in your area, each offers its own set of technical challenges, and one may be better suited for your particular needs. Let *Macworld* be your guide to the new frontier of high-speed Internet access.

#### ISDN RIDES AGAIN

Having been around for years, ISDN is the most widely available digital Internet service. It's the high-speed technology most closely related to analog-modem technology and is well understood by Internet providers, meaning it may cause you less of a headache to set up than some of the newer connection technologies.

ISDN is different from analog-modem technology and DSL in that it uses a digital phone line, not a standard analog phone line. (You can't just plug your regular phone into an ISDN jack and expect a dial tone.) Unlike analog modems, ISDN doesn't modulate an audio signal in order to send data—it can send digital data directly, making ISDN much faster than analog modems and virtually error-free.

Two-Way Speed ISDN offers symmetrical bandwidth—you can upload at the same speed as you can download, an important consideration for business users, telecommuters, people who plan on running Web servers, and anyone else who transmits a lot of data. Of course, typical Internet users tend to download a whole lot more data than they upload.

ISDN operates at speeds from 112 Kbps to 128 Kbps, depending on the type of equipment you use, and you're assured of getting that speed all the way to your Internet provider. To use ISDN, you must be within ten miles of your telephone company's nearest central office.

What It Costs An ISDN line costs about twice as much as an ordinary phone line: between \$25 and \$50 per month. Add to that another \$25 to \$50 for Internet service, and you're looking at between \$50 and \$100 per month for a complete package. However, in most areas, you must also pay a penny or two per minute to the phone company for ISDN usage, plus normal long-distance rates if you're dialing an ISDN number out of your area. Those usage charges can add up to significant expense—\$100 or more per month on top of your flat monthly rates—if you're online a lot.

However, ISDN does give you a great deal of freedom of choice. Because you can place ISDN calls anywhere in the country, and even to many international destinations, ISDN gives you complete flexibility in choosing an Internet provider. Because you can dial up different ISDN numbers, just as you can different phone numbers with an analog modem, ISDN has also become popular for companies offering telecommuting services to their employees.


Getting Connected To use ISDN, you must have an ISDN terminal adapter (sometimes called an ISDN modem) or an ISDN-capable Ethernet router. The terminal adapter connects to your Mac through a serial port (the same type of port used to connect modems and printers), while an ISDN router uses the Mac's Ethernet port. Terminal adapters are less expensive, but the Mac serial port's inherent limitations peg top throughput at



#### The Digital Age

When it comes to sheer speed, both cable modems and DSL rocket past the V.90 analog modems that predominate today. ISDN's speed and wide availability make it a popular high-speed choice, but it can't really compete with the top speeds of DSL and cable.

#### **Behind Our Tests**

We connected a Power Macintosh G3/300 running Mac OS 8.5.1 to the Internet via each respective connection technology, and then proceeded to upload and download files to a Unix-based server located several thousand miles away from our test sites. For our Web Download test, we used Microsoft's Internet Explorer 4.0.1 to repeatedly download a frame set containing 32 different HTML, GIF,

and JPEG elements totalling 680K. For our FTP tests, we used Fetch 3.03 to repeatedly download and upload a 2.4MB Stufflt archive of a QuarkXPress document. Because we conducted these tests over the Internet, they may not be repeatable.—Macworld Lab testing supervised by Kevin Mitchell

about 100 Kbps. Routers cost more, but they let you exploit ISDN's full 128 Kbps and let several Macs and PCs share a single Internet connection.

You also must order a special ISDN phone line from your local telephone company. Most ISDN Internet providers offer a package deal where they order the line for you and supply an ISDN terminal adapter or router. One caveat: be certain that your ISDN Internet provider is a local call from your location. Otherwise, you'll have

to pay per-minute charges in addition to all your other fees.

Over the years, Macworld has tested virtually all the Macintosh-friendly ISDN devices (see "Connect with ISDN," October 1997); a visit to the product-review archives at www.macworld.com will help you choose the best ISDN gear for your needs. Our favorite is probably the \$550 Pipeline 75 from Ascend (www.ascend.com), a reliable, inexpensive, and easy-to-configure ISDN router. Prices range from \$300 for single-user devices to \$600 for multiuser ISDN routers.

#### DSL COMES OF AGE

As local phone companies and their competitors have rushed to deploy DSL service in major metropolitan areas, DSL has been the subject of a lot of recent hype. DSL works by adding digital-data-transmission capabilities to an ordinary phone line—if you get DSL, your phone wire will carry both analog voice signals and digital data. A device called a splitter, installed by your DSL provider where your phone lines enter your house, separates the analog phone line (which then connects to the ordinary phone jacks in your house) from the DSL line. The DSL line then runs from the splitter to a DSL modem.

Slower Up than Down The variation of DSL that you'll most likely encounter is ADSL, or Asymmetrical DSL—so named because upload and download speeds can differ, unlike with ISDN. DSL requires that you be within about three miles of your telephone company's central office (in contrast with ISDN's ten-mile limit)—and DSL's maximum speed drops as the distance increases. At its fastest, DSL can deliver an impressive 6 Mbps for downloads and 640 Kbps for uploads—more than forty times faster than ISDN for downloads; at its slowest, it's about as speedy as ISDN for downloads and can be slower than an analog modem for uploads.

What It Costs DSL line costs vary by speed. Expect to pay between \$30 and \$50 per month for low-end service (384 Kbps for downloads, 128 Kbps for uploads) and between \$100 and \$200 per month for high-end service (1.5 Mbps for downloads, 384 Kbps for uploads). In addition to installing the DSL line, you'll have to subscribe with an Internet provider that's supported by your DSL provider. Some single-user connections cost as little as \$10 per month for low-end speeds. You must also pay for a

local phone line over which the DSL service rides, but that may well be your existing analog phone line.

Because DSL uses ordinary phone lines, it's available to businesses as well as homes. However, don't expect to serve your 50-user LAN with a \$100-permonth 1.5-Mbps DSL connection. Most Internet providers add a surcharge for multiple users, and business connections incur even higher surcharges.

As a bonus, Internet and DSL providers often offer telecommuter and

branch-office services that let you use DSL to interconnect remote users with your LAN. Although you'll likely pay more for these services, you'll still save a bundle over the cost of a private wide-area network.

Since most DSL connections are asymmetrical, it's impractical to run high-volume Web or FTP servers via DSL. However, low-volume servers can be run via DSL without much trouble.

Getting Connected The DSL modem connects to your Mac via the Ethernet port, because the serial ports available on most computers simply can't accommodate DSL speeds. DSL-modem prices run between \$500 and \$1,000. As with ISDN, most DSL providers offer package deals in which they order the DSL line for you and supply the necessary DSL gear. Some will even offer and install an Ethernet card if your Mac lacks an Ethernet port. If you sign up for a year or more, providers often discount start-up costs, reducing your equipment outlay to \$300 or less. (Be sure to check to see if your prospective DSL provider supports the Mac—recently, the Internet has been teeming with horror stories about ignorant DSL providers refusing to support Macs for no clear technical reason.)

The bottom line is that DSL gives you the widest selection of Internet providers of any Internet-connection technology besides the analog modem. And unlike ISDN, which incurs perminute usage charges that can be high when you're calling a distant Internet provider, DSL is a dedicated connection that's always online with no per-minute or distance-sensitive costs.

#### NOT YOUR FATHER'S CABLE TV

Perhaps the best bargain of high-speed-connection options is the cable modem, which uses your coaxial television cable and delivers speeds of up to 10 Mbps for downloads and often 50 percent or more of this speed for uploads. However, that speed can be quite variable—because that television cable must deliver traffic simultaneously to a few hundred or a few thousand users, speeds can slow if lots of people in an area are using the Internet at once.

The Cable Guy Cable modems are undeniably fast, but the nature of cable Internet services has some drawbacks. Virtually all cable Internet providers exclude competitors, so if you want a cable modem, you're stuck with your cable company as your

#### THE LAST MODEM YOU'LL EVER

When Macworld last tested 56-Kbps modems (see "The Modem Showdown," April 1998), the modem world was in horrible upheaval. Two competing standards, K56flex and x2. had torn the modem community apart. Different service providers supported different standards. Users were confused. And even worse, the modems we tested were often inconsistent, unreliable, and just plain slow.

All of that bad mojo is gone now, replaced by a unified modem standard, V.90, that will probably be the last analog-modem standard you'll ever need. This time, the modems Macworld Lab tested were all well behaved, compatible with one another, and faster

than the last batch when it comes to surfing the Web.

All five of the Macfriendly V.90 modems we tested performed comparably. FTP download speeds varied by less than 2 Kbps, and all five modems performed virtually identically when it came to sending data. As a result, the choice of which modem to buy hinges much more on price and features than it does on raw speed.

If you do a lot of uploading, however, it's important to note that these modems are still quite poky when it comes to sending data upstream. Not one of the V.90 modems we tested could keep up with the speed of an old-fashioned 33.6-Kbps modem when it came to uploading files.

#### SOFTWARE CHOICES

Of all the available fax software bundled with these modems, Global Village's GlobalFax (bundled with Global Village's \$150 Tele-Port 56K V.90 Mac Modem) is the most user friendly, powerful, and convenient to operate. STF's Faxstf (bundled with Zoom Telephonics' \$139 Zoom/Fax-Modem 56Kx) is a close second, with most of the features of GlobalFax but offering a less polished user interface. Diamond Multimedia's Faxcillitate software (included with the company's \$120 SupraExpress 56e Mac) includes a Mac-native voicemail application but has mediocre fax capabilities. The worst fax software we tested was Smith Micro's Mac-CommCenter (included with both 3Com's \$120 U.S. Robotics 56K Faxmodem and Viking Components' \$120 Viking 56K External Modem), an outdated, feature-poor package with compatibility problems under Mac OS 8.5.

All of the modems also incorporated voice-, fax-, and data-call sensing to automatically direct incoming calls to a phone or the fax software as appropriate. The modems from Zoom and Diamond offer integrated voice mail, but Zoom's modem unfortunately requires a PC sound card, making that particular feature incompatible with the Mac.

#### PAYING UP

The price you pay for a modem largely determines the level of support you'll

receive. The vendors of the most-expensive modems have Macintosh-savvy support staff and Maccentric Internet connectivity assistance. Again, Global Village excelled at Mac-oriented service, and Zoom Telephonics also offered excellent technical support. Diamond Multimedia's support came in a close second to Global Village's. Viking Components' technical support was the least helpful; when Macworld called to ask some common techsupport questions, its telephone technicians knew nothing about the Mac product's features or software. The Viking Web site also offers little Macintosh-specific support information.

#### MACWORLD'S BUYING ADVICE

If you use your modem for day-in, day-out Internet access, the extra dollars you spend for a Mac-proficient modem is a worthwhile investment. If you use your modem for faxing as well as Internet access, get a modem with good fax software: either Global Village's or Zoom's will do. Global Village's TelePort 56K V.90 Mac Modem won our Editors' Choice award. While not the cheapest or fastest modem-its list price of \$150 was the highest of all the modems', and it was a tiny bit slower than our speed champs—we feel that Global Village's excellent Mac-friendly software and support more than make up for those slight differences.

#### EDITORS' CHOICE

Global Village TelePort 56K V.90 Mac Modem With price and speed so similar among the contenders, the best modem is the one with the best features and software. Global Village (now owned by Boca Research) started life as a Mac-only vendor and knows Mac-user needs intimately, as reflected in the fit and polish of the company's software, packaging, documentation, and technical support. Internet provider. Think about that for a minute. No matter what happens to your service, no matter what complaints you have about support or performance, and no matter how much the provider raises prices down the road, you won't likely have the recourse of switching to another cable provider. Business users in urban locations or in office buildings may have to pay exorbitant installation charges. Most cable suppliers currently treat their subscribers as "viewers" rather than users and don't cater to the special needs of businesses by offering such services as dedicated IP addresses, telecommuting, and secure interoffice connectivity.

What It Costs Cable Internet service typically runs \$25 to \$50 per month in addition to whatever you pay for cable TV service. Currently, most cable providers offer only a single speed of service, don't guarantee a minimum data-transfer speed, and charge extra for multiple computers. You may need Ethernet wiring to connect your cable TV box to your computer; most cable providers ask that you arrange the installation of that wiring yourself.

Getting Connected The provider supplies you with a cable modem—costing between \$300 and \$600 but often rented as part of the service—which you connect to your computer, either via Ethernet or using a special adapter card installed in your computer. Often, the card-based methods don't support the Macintosh—check with your cable company to see if it offers a Macintosh-friendly option, such as a cable modem that uses Ethernet as its connection scheme.

#### **FULL SPEED AHEAD**

Macworld Lab ran performance tests on the gamut of modern connectivity technologies: 56K modems using the V.90 standard, ISDN, ADSL, and cable modems. The results show just how much faster the all-digital technologies are than analog modems (see the benchmark "The Digital Age").

The 56K Modem Compared with 33.6-Kbps modems, which usually reach their rated 33.6-Kbps throughput, 56-Kbps modems disappoint. The best speed we saw among 56K modems was 41.4 Kbps on an FTP download and a mere 27.5 Kbps on an FTP upload—and those numbers were not from the same modem (see "Maxed-Out Modems"). Achieving a full 56 Kbps depends on extremely clean phone lines and isn't something you can even expect to regularly achieve. (For the whole 56K modem story, see "The Last Modem You'll Ever Buy?")

speeds based on demand—either 64 Kbps for one channel or 128 Kbps for two channels—and Web browsing often doesn't move enough traffic to keep both channels dialed up. So when Macworld Lab tested ISDN's speed at Web browsing, we got results that hovered around 64 Kbps. File transfers, however, took full advantage of both channels, achieving an average throughput of 104 Kbps.

**DSL** We tested a typical Ethernet-based DSL modem over an ADSL connection that promised a download rate of 384 Kbps and an upload rate of 128 Kbps. We obtained consistent download speeds of 100 Kbps (Web) to

#### MODEMS' LAST STAND

200 Kbps (FTP). Upload speeds were slower due to the connection's asymmetrical bandwidth: top upload speeds were about 100 Kbps. That's still much faster than the speeds we achieved with the notoriously slow-to-upload 56-Kbps modems. And because our tests were on a type of DSL connection that's commonly available for home users, they don't show the upper limits of DSL's speed—you can get much higher speeds by simply paying more for a speedier DSL line.

Cable Modems At first blush, cable modems seem to win any speed contest. Macworld Lab obtained a Web-browsing speed of 134 Kbps—faster than any other high-speed option but still a far cry from the 10 Mbps (10,000 Kbps) the technology can potentially deliver. Still, these speeds are much faster than you can get with an analog modem; our file-transfer tests hit more than 350 Kbps on download and 300 Kbps on upload.

Note, however, that the speed you see with a cable modem can vary widely based on cable-modem usage in your area. Unlike ISDN and DSL, both of which guarantee a fixed data rate to your Internet provider, cable modems suffer performance drops as more of your neighbors start surfing. Moreover, cable providers can't easily address congestion problems by adding equipment—the broadcast wiring for cable subscribers is already installed and expensive to modify.

#### THE LAST WORD

The high-speed Internet service you choose depends largely on what you can get. For light-duty home use, nothing beats a cable modem for convenience and low cost. You already have the wire coming into your house, and cable Internet service costs the least of any of the high-speed services out there today, while delivering the best performance—at least for now.

If your cable company hasn't begun to offer Internet service yet, consider DSL. It's only a few dollars more per month than a cable modem for home users. If both are available in your area, you may still want to consider the long-term advantages of DSL: higher guaranteed throughput and more freedom of choice.

For small-office/home-office connectivity, where you might need to connect a small LAN of several users to the Internet, DSL is a better choice. The competitive nature of the DSL market helps minimize costs. DSL offers a range of Internet providers from which to choose, as well as enhanced business services such as telecommuting, branch-office connectivity, and low-volume Web hosting.

If you're in an area not yet served by DSL or cable modems, consider ISDN as an interim service until higher-speed access becomes available. Telephone companies and cable providers are rolling out new services at a prodigious rate in large metropolitan areas, with many forecasting complete coverage within 12 months. So if you're not far from an urban center, you may have to stick with ISDN only for a year or so.

For users in the frozen wastelands of modemsville, take heart. Today's 56-Kbps modems are the pinnacle of analog communications technology over phone lines. You'll never have to buy another analog modem for your desktop Mac after today, because the quality of the analog telephone network simply won't allow them to get any faster. And as DSL and cable technologies seep out of the metropolis to rural highways and byways, faster access will be coming your way soon. **m** 



#### Maxed-Out Modems

All the 56-Kbps modems we tested performed comparably, with only a small variation in speed. Although the Diamond Multimedia SupraExpress 56e Mac modem was our overall speed champ by a nose, it's important to note just how slow these V.90 modems are when it comes to uploading—in that test, our reference 33.6-Kbps modem was faster than every V.90 modem.

#### **Behind Our Tests**

All the modems we tested dialed in to a 400MHz Dual Pentium Xeon-based Intergraph remote-access server running Windows NT 4 and Microsoft's Internet Information Server 4.0. The scores are the average results of connecting to the server via a 3Com Courier I-Modem and an Ascend Max 1800 BRI remote-access modem with 7.0.1 Firmware. For individual results for each server-modem type, go to www.macworld.com/tests/. Our client machine was a Power Macintosh G3/300 running Mac OS 8.5.1. For our Web Download

test, we used Microsoft's Internet Explorer 4.0.1 to repeatedly download a frame set containing 32 different HTML, GIF, and JPEG elements totaling 680K. For our FTP tests, we used Fetch 3.03 to repeatedly download and upload a 2.4MB Stuffit archive of a QuarkXPress document. Because we conducted these tests over our local telephone network, they may not be repeatable.—Macworld Lab testing supervised by Kevin Mitchell

#### Tap Into the Location Manager

THIS VERSATILE CONTROL PANEL ISN'T JUST FOR FREQUENT FLIERS

ots of people think of the Location Manager as a control panel that's only for PowerBooktoting business travelers—a handy gizmo that makes it easier to reset your clock when you're jetting between San Francisco and New York, for example.

But the Location Manager -which has come with desktop Macs as well as PowerBooks since Mac OS 8.1is good for much more than city switching. It lets you reconfigure almost your entire system-everything from your default printer to the sound-output level-with a single click. Once you've mastered its secrets, you can leapfrog past a half-dozen control panels, changing your Mac's basic setup in a matter of seconds. With Location Manager 2.0 (which comes only with Mac OS 8.5) you can change your AppleTalk, TCP/IP, File Sharing, Modem, and Remote Access settings; launch any applications you want; reconfigure your e-mail client and Web browser; and turn dozens of extensions and control panels on or off without having to open a single dialog box. (Previous versions of Location Manager are more limited.)

#### **How It Works**

Location Manager lets you store the configurations from several different control panels—such as TCP/IP, Apple-Talk, and Extensions Manager—in a single location file. By activating a location setting during start-up, you change



the setup of several different control panels all at the same time.

To make this magic happen, open up the Location Manager control panel and choose New Location from the File menu. Give the new location a name, and click on Save. Then begin assembling the configuration you want, by clicking on any of the items in the Location Manager's Settings list. For each of the items, you can click on Apply to capture the settings that are currently in use on your system or click on Edit to open a control panel and change the settings to the ones you want stored. For details about work-

ing with these settings, see "Location Manager Logistics."

Here's a sampling of how you can use Location Manager to handle some routine system-setup tasks that could otherwise be a hassle.

#### One Machine, Two Personalities

Do you share your Macintosh with another person? If so, you can use Location Manager to quickly reconfigure the system for each of you on start-up. For example, my wife and I share one Mac, but we run very different systems. Locacontinues

tion Manager makes juggling our two setups a breeze. When the Mac starts up, Location Manager automatically prompts us to choose a location (see "Where Am I?"). Choosing His or Hers (the two location settings we've saved) from the pop-up menu customizes the system for each of us. Her location setting opens the Launcher on start-up (it's selected as one of the Auto-Open Items in Location Manager's Settings list); switches the Extensions Manager to a sparse set named Minimal; makes her color ink-jet printer the default printer; and turns on her Internet settings, activating her e-mail user name and password, dialing up her ISP, and directing her preferred Web browser to a custom home page containing her favorite links.

Whenever I start up the same Mac and activate my location setting, the Launcher

stays hidden, my own set of extensions gets turned on, our monochrome laser printer becomes the default printer, and all the Internet settings are switched over to accommodate my preferences—my ISP and my user name and password.

#### The Commuter Computer

If you carry a PowerBook from work to home each night, creating two location settings-one for the office and one for home-saves time. The office setting can connect your Mac to the network via Ethernet, choose a nearby workgroup printer as the default, flip on file sharing, and set up your TCP/IP control panel to access the Internet via the company network. When you go home at night, starting up with an alternative location setting can switch your AppleTalk connection from Ethernet to LocalTalk, target your personal printer as the default, and configure your TCP/IP settings to handle a dial-up connection to a local ISP.

#### Start-up Items Done Right

It's easy to have files launch themselves on start-up by using the Startup Items folder. Problem is, sometimes you don't want those items to start up—and stopping them is a hassle. You have to press the shift key at exactly the right moment to disable those start-up items.

With Location Manager, though, it's easy to create two alternate location settings—one that includes start-up items (called Auto-Open Items) and one that doesn't (see "Getting Started"). Just choose the location you want at start-up, depending on whether you want the self-launching files to be triggered.

#### **Configuration Migration**

Ever get a new computer and find yourself spending half the day reconfiguring the new system, painstakingly re-creating the settings you had on your previous Mac? Location Manager provides a valuable shortcut: you can import and export Location settings. Just launch Location Manager, activate the location setting you want to export, and choose Export Location from the File menu.



Getting Started With Location Manager, you can designate any files as Auto-Open Items. They will launch themselves whenever the location is chosen—either at start-up or at any other time during a work session.

Use the Import Settings command in Location Manager on your new system to install the settings.

#### **Location Is Everything**

Once you've tapped into the power of Location Manager, you're sure to find all sorts of reasons to create new location settings—even if you never get on another plane. **m**

#### **Location Manager Logistics**

LOCATION MANAGER IS ONE OF THE Mac's most powerful control panels but not one of the most intuitive. Here are some guiding principles to help.

- Before you even touch Location Manager, you must first create and save configuration settings for most of the individual components—such as Extensions Manager, Modem, Remote Access, TCP/IP, and Apple-Talk—that you want to control.
- Location Manager won't let you use control-panel configurations that have the name Default. If you're running control panels such as AppleTalk and Modem under default con-

figurations, duplicate those configurations and give them different names. Choose the Configurations command from the File menu in control panels such as Remote Access, Modem, TCP/IP, and AppleTalk to duplicate, rename, and save configurations.

You don't have to restart to switch locations. Just make the change in the Current Location pop-up menu in the Location Manager control panel or select the location from the Location Manager module on the control strip to change configurations. (Some settings, such as a saved Extensions Manager set, won't take effect until after restarting.)



#### Tips, Tricks, and Shortcuts

rowning in screen clutter? Clear the blight of excess windows from your desktop with a click of your mouse—two clicks at the most. For your first click, James Gates of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, suggests that you scrunch up all the windows of the active application by option-clicking the collapse box of the active window. If necessary, a second step hides the windows of all other applications (see the end of this item if you've forgotten how to do this). To expand all collapsed windows of the active application, option-click the active window's collapse box.

You can also expand and collapse all the active application's windows by option-double-clicking the title bar of any window, active or inactive. To affect just one background window, #-double-click its title bar. Now try option-#-doubleclicking an inactive window's title bar.

Note that these double-click tricks won't work if you have the relevant option turned off in the Options section of Mac OS 8.X's Appearance control panel or Mac OS 7.6's WindowShade control panel.

(To hide the windows of all but the active application, choose Hide Others from the Application menu.)

#### **Find and Replace Tabs**

How can I enter tab and return characters in the Find and Replace dialog boxes in ClarisWorks and Microsoft Word?

A. H-tab to enter a tab character. To enter a return character, type \p or press H-return. To enter a line-break character, type \n. For a list of other special charac-

ters you can enter in the Find/Change dialog box, choose the ClarisWorks help index from the Help menu and look under the keyword Finding Text and the topic "Find and change text."

In Microsoft Word (all versions), you can type 't to enter a tab character, 'p for a return character, or 'l for a line-break character. You can also choose these and other special characters from the Special pop-up menu near the bottom of the dialog box. If you don't see this pop-up



menu in Word 98, click the More button in the Find dialog box. Word 98's onscreen help has a list of special characters you can find and replace; look in the help index under the keyword Finding Data and the topic "Examples of special characters and document elements you can find and replace."

open QuickTime movies. To open WAV files in applications other than MoviePlayer, turn on the Enable Quick-Time Exchange option in the QuickTime Settings control panel. If you upgrade to QuickTime 3 Pro, you can also convert sounds to WAV files by using MoviePlayer's Export command. Mac OS 8.5 includes OuickTime 3 and a free upgrade to the Pro edition; if you haven't upgraded to 8.5 yet, you can download the standard edition of QuickTime 3 free from Apple's Web site at www.apple.com/quicktime/ and pay \$29.95 for the Pro

upgrade. QuickTime 3 works with System 7.1 and later.

If your system has QuickTime 2.5, MoviePlayer can open and play most WAV files, but SimpleText and other applications can open only some WAV files. With QuickTime 2.5, even Movie-Player can't open a few WAV files that it can open with QuickTime 3—it's rather arbitrary, so the only way to really know for sure is to give it a try. You can also convert between WAV files and Mac sound files with freeware such as Norman Franke's SoundApp.

#### Make Some Euros



How can I write the euro currency symbol (€)?

Apple has added the euro symbol to . the following fonts distributed with Mac OS 8.5 and later: Apple Chancery, Capitals, Charcoal, Chicago, Courier, Gadget, Geneva, Helvetica, Hoefler Text, Monaco, New York, Palatino, Sand, Skia, Symbol, Techno, Textile, and Times. With any of these fonts except Symbol, you type a euro symbol by pressing option-shift-2. With the Symbol font, you press option-T. Apple is not currently distributing these updated fonts separately from Mac OS 8.5.

If you don't have Mac OS 8.5 or 8.5.1, you can obtain three free euro fonts from Adobe's Web site at www .adobe.com/supportservice/custsupport

#### Stickies Gets Personal


JUST WHEN YOU LEAST EXPECT IT, ALONG COME NOT ONE BUT TWO WAYS to enhance the inconspicuous Stickies program that the Mac OS has included since System 7.5.

Michael Merwin of Gracewood, Georgia, noticed that Stickies remembers two positions for each note, one for when the note is open and the other for when it's collapsed, and he uses this feature to organize his notes. He clicks each note's zoom box to collapse it and stacks the collapsed notes in a corner of his desktop (see "Stickies Tricks"). Stickies displays the first line of each collapsed note in its title bar, reminding him of the note's contents.

Clicking a collapsed note's zoom box opens it in its previous location, and clicking its zoom box again returns it to the stack of collapsed notes. If you have the Zoom-Box Collapses Window option turned off in Stickies' Preferences menu, you need to option-click a note's zoom box to collapse it.

James C. LaRoche of Marina del Rey, California, discovered how to change the text that Stickies prints before and after your name in the footer of every note you print (by default, Stickies uses the Owner Name from the File Sharing or Sharing Setup control panel). To change the footer text, you need a resource editor such as Apple's ResEdit freeware or Mathemaesthetics' Resorcerer (www .mathemaesthetics.com).

First, create a duplicate of the Stickies application in the Apple Menu Items folder and name the duplicate Stickies Personal. Open Stickies Personal in your resourceediting program of choice, and double-click the STR# resource item in the Stickies Personal resources window. In the STR# resources window that appears, double-click resource ID 134, Printing. The window for this resource shows three text strings you can edit to personalize your Stickies. It's easy to make additional personalized copies of Stickies with names such as Stickies Business and Stickies Funny.



/LIBRARY/503a.htm. With each of the fonts—sans serif, serif, and monospace—you can type a euro symbol by pressing any key. These fonts work with any Mac OS version, but sizes other than 10 point tend to look jagged on screen and with non-PostScript printers unless you have Adobe Type Manager installed.

Microsoft also distributes updated versions of its core fonts on its Web site at www.microsoft.com/typography/fontpack/default.htm. You can use these TrueType fonts with any Mac OS system.

The LaserWriter 8.6 driver software, which Mac OS 8.5 and 8.5.1 include, performs a euro-related trick with many fonts. It prints a euro symbol from the Symbol font everywhere it encounters an option-shift-2 character in a font internally designated a Mac-encoded font, even if this character appears on screen as an international currency symbol. If the printer has the Symbol font built in and this Symbol font does not contain the euro symbol, the LaserWriter 8.6 driver adds the euro to the printer's existing Symbol font.

Sad to say, older LaserWriter drivers do not normally substitute the euro from the Symbol font. Instead, LaserWriter 8.5.1 and earlier print the international currency symbol wherever an optionshift-2 character appears in a Macencoded font.

### The Taming of Director 7


A GUIDED TOUR OF THIS MULTIMEDIA MONOLITH'S FRIENDLY NEW FEATURES

hat if I said you could create an interactive project in Macromedia Director without having to write scripts in Director's Lingo language? You'd probably wonder what I was smoking. Sorry, Cheech-with Director 7, it really is possible to make multimedia without having to learn a lick of Lingo. Director has always required tiresome scripting to add even a simple navigation button, but Director 7 is a brand-new, friendlier beast that even beginners can use without needing to take a three-day training seminar.

Macromedia has greatly enhanced and expanded Director 7's library of behaviors—canned Lingo scripts that you attach to media elements—to make quick work of many authoring chores: navigation, QuickTime-movie playback, and accessing media over the Internet (see Reviews, April 1999).

To demonstrate how much easier multimedia authoring is in Director 7, let me guide you through the process of creating an interactive project using the drag-and-drop ease of Director's helpful new features. Along the way, I'll pass along some extra tips for using Director 7. I've additionally created an example project you can download from www.macworld.com/more/. It incorporates an opening screen, a main menu, screens containing text and QuickTime movies, and another screen that dynamically loads a Web page.



### Step 1: Import Your Media

The first phase in a Director project often involves importing media—movies, graphics, sounds, and so on—you've created in other programs. As with previous

Director versions, you use the File menu's Import command to bring elements into the Cast window, Director's database for holding your project's elements.

continues

You can also import media from the Internet by clicking on the Import dialog box's Internet button and entering a URL. If you choose Link To External File from the Import Type pop-up menu, Director 7 creates a link to the Internet-based media rather than importing the actual file. Then each time the project runs, Director automatically updates the media—perfect for CD-ROMs that retrieve updates over the Web.

TIP You can also import media by dragging and dropping media files from the Finder to the Cast window.

### Step 2: Structure the Score

Director's Score window provides a timelinelike view into a project's overall design, with numbered frames that hold media elements, scripts, behaviors, transitions, and more. Normally, Director wants to play a project straight from first frame to last. That's fine if you're simply creating an animation, but it's not suitable for an interactive project where the playback sequence depends on a user's navigation choices.


In previous Director versions, controlling playback usually meant writing Lingo scripts. For example, it was com-

### **Embed a Font**

TO ENSURE THAT YOUR PROJECT'S TEXT displays in the desired font, embed that font in your project. Choose Font from the Insert menu's Media Element submenu, and complete the Font Cast Member Properties dialog box.

First, choose the font and style to embed (A). If your project contains text

in small point sizes, you can often improve its legibility by embedding bitmapped versions of the font in those sizes. Enter all the point sizes here (B). If small file size is paramount (for Shockwave-destined projects, it usually is), you can embed specific characters only (instead of the entire font) by typing them here (C).



mon to write a script that would essentially tell Director, "Play the current frame over and over again until the user clicks on a button; then jump to frame X." Director 7's enhanced behavior library

eliminates this manual labor.

Director's Jump To Marker Button navigation behavior relies on *markers*, those handy bookmarklike placeholders you can create in the Score window. Since you'll typically use this behavior throughout projects, it's essential to create markers for each scene in a project (see "Make Your Mark").

TIP Markers are also convenient navigation aids. Using the Markers window or the Score window's Markers menu, you can quickly jump to a section of the Score without having to scroll your way there.

With a feature that debuted in Director 6, you can also use markers to synchronize a project's playback to an audio track. For details, see "Cue Me Up," in "Director 6 Secrets," June 1997.


### Step 3: Create Your Screens

With your markers made and your media imported, you're ready to create your screens. Use Director's built-in tools to create text headings, bitmapped graphics (see "Embed a Font"), and vector shapes as needed. Drag media elements such as QuickTime movies (see "Easy QuickTime-Movie Playback") from the Cast window onto the Stage or into the Score. When you do, Director creates a *sprite*—a capsule of information—that controls the Cast member's appearance, location, duration, and other properties.

### Make Your Mark

MARKERS ARE BOOKMARKLIKE PLACE-holders that you create to serve as targets for scripts and behaviors, to help you navigate through a project in progress, and more. To create a marker, click in the Markers channel (A) in the Score window and type the marker's name. To move a marker, drag its upside-down triangle (B). To

jump to a specific marker, choose its name from the Marker pull-down menu (C), and to jump to the next or previous marker, click on the arrow buttons (D). The Hold On Current Frame behavior noted under each marker (E) causes the playback to stay in the current frame.



Finally, use the Score window to fine-tune the duration of the sprites. In my example project, most sprites have a duration of just one or two frames—I used behaviors that cause playback to loop on a single frame until the user clicks on a navigation button.

TIP If you know in advance that most sprites will have a specific duration, set Director's preferences accordingly and save yourself some sprite-resizing time. To do so, simply choose Sprite from the File menu's Preferences submenu, and in the Sprite Preferences dialog box, type a number in the Frames text box next to Span Duration.

### Step 4: Add Interactivity

With your cast of characters in place, you're ready to attach behaviors to them using the new Library palette. Attaching a behavior to an element generally involves just dragging the desired behavior from the palette and dropping it onto the element (see "Make Buttons Behave" and "Display Updating Web Text").

Some behaviors require additional parameters—the name of the marker to which you want to jump, for instance, or the address of the Web page you want to display. When you attach one of these behaviors, a dialog box for supplying the required parameters appears.

TIP You can (and often must) attach multiple behaviors to a sprite. If you're creating a button that jumps to a marker, for instance, you might first attach the Push Button behavior to control a sprite's continues


### **Make Buttons Behave**

DIRECTOR 7'S LIBRARY PALETTE IS THE gateway to creating buttons that change when a user mouses over and clicks on them. The Push Button behavior in the Controls category makes it easy to create these multiple-state buttons (you can access categories via the Library List popup menu [A]).

First, create a separate Cast member for each of the button states you want to implement: normal, mouse-over, mouse-down, and so on. Position the normal-state version of the graphic on the Stage. Then drag the Push Button

behavior (B) to the graphic. In the Parameters dialog box, specify the Cast members to use for each state.

Note that the Push Button behavior affects only the appearance of the button—it doesn't actually program a jump to another section of your project. To do that, use one of the Navigation category's behaviors. Or use the Jump To Marker Button behavior (C) in the Controls category: drag the Jump To Marker Button behavior to the button, and choose a marker from the pop-up menu (D) in the Parameters dialog box.




### Easy QuickTime-Movie Playback

DIRECTOR 7 PROVIDES A VARIety of ways to play QuickTime movies in a project, and most require working with multiple behaviors or Lingo scripts. But there's an easy way to implement basic movie playback.

First, select the movie in either the Cast window or the Stage window. Choose Properties from the Modify menu's Cast Member submenu. In the Properties dialog box, click on Options and complete the Quick-

Time Xtra Properties dialog box. To have the movie open but not play immediately, check Paused (A). Then check Show Controller (B) to display the standard QuickTime-movie controller, which enables users to play, pause, and scroll through the movie and adjust its volume.

In order to link to a movie located on the Web, click on the Internet button (C) and type the movie's URL in the subsequent dialog box.



appearance, swapping in different Cast members for rollovers and mouse-down events. Then you might attach the Jump To Marker Button to specify what you want that button to do.

### Step 5: Test and Deploy

After you've fleshed out your project's interactivity, you can save it as a standalone application (called a *projector*, most commonly used for CD-ROM distribution) or as a Shockwave movie (which can play in a Web browser armed with the Shockwave plug-in).

For Shockwave development, Director 7 includes numerous new behaviors that simplify the tricky process of creating streaming projects (projects that play back as they download). By using these behaviors, you can ensure, for example, that all media required for a particular section load before it plays.

The behaviors you're likely to use most often are the looping and jumping behaviors, which enable you to pause and otherwise control playback while items download. And also experiment with the progress bar and placeholder behaviors—they enable you to provide essential visual feedback to users.

TIP If you're creating Shockwavedestined projects, take advantage of the File menu's new Preview In Browser command. It enables you to assess how your project will behave in a browser.

And speaking of Shockwave, no Webdestined project is complete without a visit to the bundled Aftershock utility. Aftershock not only creates the tags necessary to add a Shockwave movie to a Web page but it also gets rid of some of those annoying "missing plug-in" errors. For example, you can specify that users who don't have Shockwave see a JPEG placeholder image instead.

### What's Next?

The process I've outlined here doesn't create a project with the complexities of Myst, but it does incorporate the most commonly used media types and navigation techniques. And as promised, it didn't require a lick of Lingo. Well, actually, I'm lying. The truth is, behaviors *are* Lingo scripts—indeed, they're often extremely complex Lingo scripts. You just don't have to type them in yourself.


After you've mastered Director 7's behaviors, you should consider exploring the scripts behind them (use the Behavior


### **Display Updating Web Text**

THE GET NET TEXT BEHAVIOR (IN THE Library palette's Text category, via the Library List pop-up menu [A]) is your key to creating interactive projects—such as CD-ROMs—that retrieve up-to-theminute text updates from the Web.

To do this, create a text Cast member containing placeholder text and position it on the Stage. Specify the text box's size in the Sprite Properties dialog box, which you access by choosing Properties from the Modify menu's Sprite submenu.

Next, drag the Get Net Text behavior (B) onto the text box and complete the Parameters dialog box. Specify the URL (C) of the file you want to display. If the file contains HTML formatting tags, check Treat Text As HTML (D). In my example here, I used HTML for basic formatting, such as the bold headings and line breaks. To have the text box update as soon as it appears, choose frame from the Activation pop-up menu (E). The HTML page then appears, formatting intact, within your project.

### The Automatic Publisher

YOU DO THE CREATING-LET APPLESCRIPT DO THE DRUDGERY

he Mac is better suited than ever to automating your work, although that wasn't always the case. Ten years ago, if you needed to automate your computer, it was better to get a PC. The Macintosh operating system just wasn't set up for batch processing and scripted automation. But the tides have changed—the Macintosh now ships with the superior automation system.


The key to automating your Mac is AppleScript, which is built into the operating system. AppleScript 1.3 (the version that comes with System 8.5) is finally PowerPC native, which means it's several times faster than it was in older systems. Even better, you can now attach scripts to folders so that when you interact with a folder (for instance, add a file or move the folder's window), the script runs automatically.

With these attached scripts, called folder actions, you can trigger a whole sequence of steps simply by dragging a file into a specific folder or by opening a folder. You could, for instance, trigger a script that has your Mac save a piece of artwork as an EPS file in QuarkXPress, rasterize it in Adobe Photoshop, and then place it on your Web server.

In fact, that's exactly what the scripts in this article do (see "From Page to Web").

### WHAT YOU NEED

- Apple's AppleScript
- Apple's Script Editor
- · QuarkXPress 4.04 or later, or 3.X
- Adobe Photoshop 5
- · Main Event PhotoScripter
- · File-transfer utility



You can use them, with minor modifications, to automate your publishing process.

### **Have No Fear**

Before I dive into the heavy-duty process of scripting QuarkXPress, Photoshop, and a file-transfer utility, let me first show you how simple AppleScript can be. Telling your computer what to do is technically computer programming—but before you panic, remember that Apple-Script is different from any other kind of programming. First of all, you don't need any special software to write these kinds of programs. Second, the AppleScript language looks like everyday English.

Keeping the panic under control is important, because AppleScript is an incredibly powerful language that can speed up your work and make your life exponentially better. If you've never programmed before, here's your chance to find out how much fun it is to write something in text and have your computer follow your orders. Try this:

1. Fire up the Script Editor application (you'll find it in the Apple Extras folder on your hard drive unless you've moved or deleted the application). Several commercial applications on the market let you script easier and faster than Script Editor, but this one is free.

2. Type this script:

tell application "Finder"
activate
open window of startup disk
set position of window ¬
of startup disk to {30, 50}
end tell

Finally, click on the Run button in Script Editor to see the script in action.

This script is not only a simple introduction to AppleScript, but also demoncontinues strates a few of the syntax rules to follow when writing your own scripts. First, you must direct your commands to a particular application or object. This script directs commands at the Finder itself. The word activate tells the Finder to become the active, frontmost application. The ¬ character (option-L) means that the command continues on the next line. To specify a position for an object on screen, set the coordinates inside braces. In my example, the script sets the hard drive's window at 30 pixels in and 50 pixels down. Finally, you must match all tell operators with an end tell command (it's like saying "at ease" to the application).

The more complex the task, the more complex the script. But you can do powerful operations even with simple scripts.

### What's Scriptable?

Being able to script the Finder is pretty cool. Being able to script the Finder in conjunction with other programs is awesome. For instance, AppleScript can take a FileMaker Pro database full of information and build a fully formatted catalog or directory in under a minute (this is how some newspapers create their daily television guides and weather information). Similarly, AppleScript can process a folder full of XPress documents, converting all the fake fractions into true ones. AppleScript can even parse your e-mail (in Eudora Pro or Claris Emailer) and take action based on what it finds.

While you can't automate all applications with AppleScript, you can script many key players, such as QuarkXPress. Photoshop is also scriptable, but in a limited way (see "Script Photoshop"). Even by scripting just these programs, you will enhance your productivity significantly.

### What about Macros?

The most important difference between scripting and macros is that scripting lets you query the program you're automating. For instance, a script could ask QuarkXPress what the name of the current document is and then type that name into a text box on every page of your document. While macros can be useful, there's no way they can perform a task like this. Go with AppleScript when you need efficiency and power. **m** 



### Folder Actions

The ability to attach AppleScripts to folders (new in System 8.5) is extraordinary. You can start a script action in any of five ways: open or close a folder, move a folder's open window, and add items to or remove them from a folder.

Unfortunately, the procedure for attaching a script to a folder is a little obscure. You must first write an AppleScript in a program such as Script Editor. Then, add one or more of the special new on scripting commands (see the sample scripts here for examples).

You can get more information about how to write scripts for folder actions by selecting AppleScript Help from the Help menu in Script Editor.



### **Open Sesame**

The Finder is more scriptable than ever. In this example, when you open the folder, the script asks if you want to open the folder's files. It also makes the Finder interactive using the statement display dialog. Here, the variable this\_folder is set automatically to the file path of the folder with the attached script.



### **Folder Police**

Folder actions run only on folders that are open or that you are opening. Here's a script that stops anyone from closing a folder you need to keep open.



This symbol tells you there's a folder action attached to this folder.

### Attach a Folder

Once you've saved your script to disk, click on a folder with the control key held down and select Attach A Folder Action from the context-sensitive menu. Remember that you can attach more than one script to a folder. If you want to edit or detach the script later, there are items in the context-sensitive menu for that, too.

### From Page to Web

task is automating an entire workflow. The scripts here show how you can automate the process of converting a Quark-XPress document into a Web-ready file, using AppleScript, QuarkXPress, Photoshop, Dartmouth College's Fetch, and Internet Explorer. The specific process I'm illustrating is updating a Web page with an ad created in QuarkXPress.

It's easy to get an ad in XPress onto the Web even without AppleScript: just save the ad as an EPS file, rasterize it (turn it into a bitmap) in Photoshop, save it to disk as a GIF or JPEG, and put it on your Web server. But if you had to change the ad everyday, this process would soon get tiresome—so why not automate the workflow?

I built this workflow with three scripts, each attached to a


folder using System 8.5's new Folder Actions feature (see "Folder Actions"). These hot folders automatically run their scripts when you drop one or more files into them.

Note that while the scripts shown here will work "off the shelf," they won't work in all circumstances. You can download the full versions of the scripts, which are more robust and less likely to break, from www.macworld.com/more/. You can modify the scripts to fit your needs or study them to learn basic concepts about creating your own. Don't forget some other important sources of information in your quest to learn more about Apple-Script: Apple's AppleScript Page (www.apple.com/applescript/), the AppleScript Sourcebook (www.AppleScriptSourcebook.com), Everything CD for Mac Scripting (www.everythingcd.com/scripting/), and Scripting on the Web (www.scriptweb.org).

### Script QuarkXPress

QuarkXPress is ideal for making simple ads because it has great typographic features and lets you repurpose content that you've already used in print materials. XPress is also one of the most scriptable and scripted applications on the Mac. Here I've built an ad in a document that is the same size as the ad itself so that I won't need to worry about cropping it later. After building the ad, the first step is to export it as an EPS file from QuarkXPress. Here, the script reads item 1 of added\_items in case someone drags more than one file into the folder. If the file is an XPress document, the script exports the first page as an EPS file and then closes the document.

If you want to script XPress 4, make sure you're using version 4.04 or later (earlier versions were too buggy to bother with). Also note that many scripts that worked with QuarkXPress 3.X require modifications to work with XPress 4, because of the way the newer version handles boxes (especially Bézier boxes).



XPressly Stated The first script tells the Finder to open the ad in XPress, and tells XPress to save the ad as an EPS.




Daily Ad You never have to touch the ad. The script opens QuarkXPress and does the work for you.

### Script Photoshop

People who script have clamored for Adobe to make Photoshop AppleScriptable for years. Unfortunately, the cries have fallen on deaf ears, and Photoshop lets you use scripting only to open files (using the *open* command) and run premade Photoshop Actions (using the *do script* command). Photoshop also lets you batch-process a folder of images using one or more Actions, but only from within the program, not via scripting. While you can do a lot within these constraints, they leave much to be desired. Fortunately, Main Event (www.mainevent.com) has released Photo-Scripter, a plug-in that adds scripting functionality to Photoshop 5.

Photoshop's Actions are easy to create, but PhotoScripter beats them out in several ways. For instance, the second step in my workflow (converting the EPS file to a JPEG) would be impossible to do as an Action.

When attached to a folder, this AppleScript uses the EPS Generic filter to open in Photoshop any EPS files that appear in the folder. You can control all the important properties of the Open As Generic EPS dialog box here: color space, antialiasing, and size.



**Permission to Rasterize** This script opens the ad in Photoshop, flattens it, saves it as a JPEG file in the JPEG Versions folder, closes the rasterized image, and moves on to the next image.


### 3 Automate the Transfer

The final step in this automated workflow is to get the new JPEG image onto my Web server. Fortunately, you can script both Fetch and Stairways Software's Anarchie Pro (these file-transfer utilities are shareware, available at online sites, including www.macworld.com). In my sample script, I use Fetch. This script, also set up as a Folder action, launches as soon as the JPEG file drops into its folder, immediately uploading it to the proper folder on the Web site. (You should replace this Web site with your own, of course.)

The script doesn't have to end here. For example, you could add another line at the end of the script that reads:

tell application "Internet Explorer 4.01"
openURL "http://www.macworld.com/" ¬
& "myfolder/myfile.html" ¬
Flags 1
end tell

This would open the proper HTML file in Explorer so you could make sure your ad looked correct on the final page.

### Digital Art Unplugged

MAKING IMAGERY THAT BELIES ITS ELECTRONIC ORIGINS


or digital artists trying to achieve the look-and-feel of traditionalmedia art techniques, the real challenge becomes blending and altering elements to make the final piece look as though it was created with paint and pen rather than by pixel pushing.

San Francisco-based illustrator and graphic artist Frank Kozik has experimented with Photoshop filters over the years to make the elements he uses in his art—cartoon drawings, photographs, synthetic textures, and found images—look painted rather than digital. His goal with many of his designs is not to create fantastic, slick imagery that's obviously computer-based but to make art that looks like it comes from the nonelectronic world.

Kozik has been creating concert posters and album-cover art for underground bands since the mid-1980s. His posters featuring Soviet-style soldiers, Lichtensteinian women, and cartoon characters have become prized collectibles, and some of his poster art is in the Smithsonian Museum. But he's probably best known to Macintosh users for his in-your-face illustrations for now-defunct Macclone maker Power Computing.

In this piece, Kozik says, he was trying to imitate the look-and-feel of an old, weathered billboard with its layers of art in various states of decomposition. He started with several of his favorite elements: hand-drawn cartoon characters, a cross and an American flag created in Adobe Illustrator, and scans of found art. He added filter effects in Photoshop to soften the edges and add texture and selected and eliminated random parts of each image, using the magic-wand tool and layer masks to create a splatteredpaint look. Then he scanned in and distorted an oil painting and superimposed it at a very low opacity on the rest of the art.

Although the art looks "natural," Kozik's setup for this project was mostly

digital: a Power Computing Power-Tower Pro 225; 1GB of RAM; a 14GB Bellstor external hard drive; an external Iomega Jaz drive; two Sony Trinitron monitors (20- and 21-inch); Adobe Photoshop 3.0; Adobe Illustrator 6.0; Adobe Streamline 4.0; Adobe Gallery

Effects; and Tormentia Photoshop filters, included with *Maeworld Photoshop 5 Bible* (IDG Books Worldwide, 1998). **m** 

MIKE WOOLDRIDGE (www.mediacosm.com) is a freelance writer and new-media designer based in Berkeley, California. Nozik began the project with seven graphic elements. He hand-drew and scanned in the cat's-head illustration and created the American flag, military cross, flames, and "Man's Ruin Records" text in Illustrator. He scanned in the dice and wolf images from 1950s decals found at an antique store. Kozik imported all these elements into separate Photoshop files.





2 To soften the hard edges and give texture to the flat areas of color and gradients, he applied to each separate file Photoshop's Add Noise filter and the classic Dry Brush filter from Adobe Gallery Effects (filters included in Photoshop 4 and later).









3 Next, he used a Tormentia filter to adjust the colors of each element in its separate Photoshop file so they would complement each other in the final image. He followed this up with another dose of the Dry Brush to amplify the earlier textures and give the elements even more of a painted feel.



Kozik then brought each element into separate layers of a single Photoshop file. Working on one layer at a time, he selected random areas of the illustrations, using the magic-wand tool followed by the Similar command, and deleted the selected areas via the layer mask. You can see the splattered-paint results of this technique in the pair of wolves' heads. He also lowered the opacity in some layers to reveal images in lower layers.



Sozik's final step was to scan and invert a randomly selected image—an oil painting of clowns scanned from the cover of a 1970s English magazine—and add lots of random noise to it. He superimposed this over the final collage at a low opacity to add an extra element of texture.

# The Desktop Critic

## Attack of the Living E-Mail

IN THE BATTLE OF MAN VERSUS IN-BOX, SOFTWARE WINS

OW COULD ANYone not love e-mail?
It's cheap; it fosters
literacy; it provides
a written record of
what's been said.
Best of all, it's delivered almost instantaneously, like a
phone call—but you answer it at your
leisure, like U.S. mail. Nobody ever had
to get up from dinner to answer an e-mail.
(Nobody with a life, anyway.)

Unfortunately, e-mail can get out of hand. Take my bloated, overtaxed Claris Emailer box: spam, mailing lists, and tech-support pleas from readers were drowning me, even as my book deadlines were crashing down in flames. One frightening morning I awoke to find that I was exactly 1,749 messages behind.

I did some research: How did other high-e-mail-traffic individuals handle the deluge? Andy Gore, Macworld's editor in chief, reads all messages, forwards lots to appropriate parties, but responds only to the ones he's best qualified to answer. Harry Connick Jr. lets his office handle requests (autographs, tour dates, photos); he answers the others according to "the lottery system." Rush Limbaugh claims to get 12,000 messages a day, which he promptly deletes. (In that case, why publish your e-mail address at all?)

As best as I could tell, those strategies rely primarily on deleting huge swaths of messages. Yet much of my material comes from the suggestions, corrections, and ideas in those e-mails. Furthermore, my hardwired Midwestern sense of duty compels me to answer reader messages as part of the unwritten book buyer-author contract. How could I keep both my e-mail address and my sanity? I decided to apply technology to the problem.

## E-mail Sanity Strategy

Phase I: Delete Spam Too many of my incoming e-mails run along the lines of

"MAKE MONEY SALTING CRACK-ERS AT HOME!" or "SEXXXXY TRUCK DRIVERS ARE WAITING FOR YOUR CALL!" If I'd started my Internet life ten years ago by keeping one address just for e-mail, I wouldn't be in this mess. My mistake was posting messages on bulletin boards, where software-scavenger spam robots pick up addresses.

Still, I found a way out in, of all places, *Macworld*. A sidebar in "Tame Your E-Mail" (June 1998, available at www



.macworld.com) leaked the trick to having your e-mail program route spam automatically to the Trash. Bingo!

Phase II: Autofile I subscribe to a bunch of Internet mailing lists, such as the EvangeList and a PalmPilot discussion group. Using the same filtering trick described in that *Macworld* article, I taught my e-mail program to autofile mailing-list messages into folders of their own. Only actual personal messages remained in my in-box.

Phase III: FAQs To siphon the frequently asked questions out of my e-mail, I created a FAQs page at my Web site. No longer did I have to type out answers to "How do I do a clean install?" and "What's a Type 3 error?"; instead, I

could refer the authors of such questions to www.davidpogue.com.

Phase IV: TypeIt4Me This brilliant shareware control panel (available at www macdownload.com) lets you set up auto-expanding abbreviations that work in any program. I type ty and get "thank you." I type csi and get "A clean system-folder install will solve your problem." I type gbye and get "In this age of impersonal, faceless communication, isn't it wonderful that we can take a quiet moment to exchange personal messages?"

Phase V: Denial of Service

Most of my tech-support messages come from readers of my books; in this world of \$35 calls to Apple, I can understand their plight. Where's a person supposed to turn for help these days?

Unfortunately, more and more of these messages begin: "I heard in a chat room that you give free tech support. So here's the problem with my ImageWriter..."

After much soul-searching, I decided to play hardball. I created a macro that offers ten free sources of help, such as Apple's Tech Info Library and NoWonder.com. This macro explains that I just can't an-

swer personal questions from everyone on the planet—and still have time to write stuff that could help larger groups of people.

## Après le Déluge

My assault on Mount E-Mail, I'm happy to say, has cut the tidal wave down to a mere waterfall. Nowadays, my software tricks let me spend only two hours a day answering mail.

Meanwhile, I'm still on the quest for shortcuts. If you've got any great ideas, my e-mail address is david@—actually, never mind. **m**
